Employer reimbursement program for COVID-19 now launched

Employers can now apply for reimbursement of wages paid to workers who took sick leave concerning COVID-19.

The temporary reimbursement program was effective as of June 17th and is retroactive to May 20th.

The program helps ensure sick workers could stay home for up to three days without losing any wages helping to support businesses during the pandemic.

Amendments to the Employment Standards Act (ESA) requires that employers pay sick workers their regular wages. Employers can apply for up to \$200 per day for a maximum of three days for each worker sick. Employers that do not currently provide paid sick leave benefits are also eligible to apply.

The reimbursement program is accessible to businesses where workers need to stay home because they have been confirmed to have COVID-19, are waiting for COVID-19 test results, need to self-isolate or monitor for symptoms, or have been directed to stay home by their employer due to exposure or risk of exposure.

WorkSafeBC is administering the program with funding from the government. WorkSafeBC's IT systems and employer information have set up a new process to deliver the reimbursement—which expires on December 31, 2021.

To apply for this reimbursement, businesses and employers must be registered for WorkSafeBC compensation coverage and have signed up for online services. A short online form is a requirement. Once submitted, the application and payment transfer can take up to 10 business days.





Boater safety on the Peace River



Kiskatinaw Campground Closed due to Landslide

The Kiskatinaw Campground and Provincial Park is closed until further notice due to landslide risk.

As the park is below the Kiskatinaw Curved Bridge, which is closed due to landsliding affecting bridge stability - it made sense to close the campground from the public as well.

Earlier this month the Old Kiskatinaw Bridge was closed to vehicle traffic - on the morning of June 4.

Engineering staff closed the bridge and it will remain closed

until the material stops moving and the bridge can be assessed. Geotechnical and structural engineers, as well as operational staff are on site assessing the situation.

The Ministry of Transportation says a landslide has occurred under the old wooden bridge, affecting one of the piers. Engineering staff closed the bridge June 3 and it will remain closed until the material

stops moving and the bridge can be assessed.

The wooden bridge was built in the early 1940s during construction of the Alaska Highway. A new modern bridge was built upstream over the Kiskatinaw River in the 1970s, when the highway was rerouted.

More Direct Flights for locals



Central Mountain Air is adding flights out of Fort St. John to Edmonton three times weekly as of June 28.

As pandemic restrictions ease in B.C. and Alberta, the airline said Tuesday that it's poised for a "major

increase" to its network of regional routes.

On Monday, June 28 non-stop service will begin or resume from Edmonton to Grande Prairie, High Level, and Fort St John. Frequency of flights will also increase to Prince George with connections to Terrace and Fort Nelson, CMA stated in a release.

"CMA is pleased to expand on its existing four times weekly onestop connections with these flights."

CMA says it will be operating more than 120 flights per week with its expanded schedule, about 50% of its pre-pandemic totals, and providing a "critical baseline" to ensure proper access to rural and remote communities.

"With travel demand beginning to recover and mainline carriers looking at the regional part of their models differently than pre-COVID, our strategy has been to think creatively about how to use our fleet to add capacity back in, generate revenue, and get more people back to work," said CMA CEO Bob Cummings in a statement.

"Aggressively connecting Edmonton with non-stop air links to key northern cities, and via Prince George to more B.C. cities, is a bold move by CMA, as the scheduled air carrier landscape re-forms in different ways."

Health Related Services Grant in Aid - Entire Peace River Region, including Municipalities

On Saturday, July 17, 2021 qualified electors within the proposed Health Related Services Grant in Aid Service Area, which is the Peace River Regional District in its entirety, including municipalities, will be voting on the following question:

"Are you in favour of the Peace River Regional District adopting "Health Related Services Grant in Aid Service Establishment Bylaw No. 2445, 2021", to establish a new service to provide grants in aid to not for profit societies to enhance the quality and availability of health related services, and to provide scholarships to students seeking post secondary education in a health care or medical field, at a maximum annual tax requisition limit that is the greater of \$750,000 or \$0.05/\$1000 on the net taxable value of land and improvements, and assessed on improvements only?"

Note: The property tax limit of \$0.05 per \$1,000 is an average of rates of all classes on land and improvements to determine the maximum amount that may be raised in any one year based on that year's net taxable assessment. The estimated residential tax rate for the first year is \$0.0288 per \$1000. The tax rate is applicable to improvements only.

Seniors Aging in Place Support Services - Electoral Area D and a portion of Electoral Area E

On Saturday, July 17, 2021 qualified electors within the proposed Seniors Aging in Place Support Services Service Area, which is Electoral Area D, and a defined portion of Electoral Area E, will be voting on the following question:

"Are you in favour of the Peace River Regional District adopting "Seniors Aging In Place Support Services Establishment Bylaw No. 2444, 2021", to establish a new service to provide support services, to seniors in Area D and defined portions of Area E, to allow them to remain healthy and safely in their homes, such as provision of healthy meals, housekeeping, and yard maintenance, at a maximum annual tax requisition limit that is the greater of \$1,900,000 or \$.66/\$1,000 on the net taxable value of land and improvements, and assessed on improvements only?"

Note: The property tax limit of \$0.66/\$1,000 is an average of rates on all classes, on land and improvements to determine the maximum amount that may be raised in any one year based on that year's net taxable assessment.

The estimated residential tax rate for the first year is \$0.283 per \$1,000. The tax rate is applicable to improvements only.

Mail Ballot Voting

In recognition of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the Peace River Regional District has expanded the option for mail ballot voting to ALL eligible voters in these two assent voting proceedings. Anyone qualified to vote in these proceedings as either a resident, or as a non-resident property elector, may choose to vote by mail.

Mail ballots must be received by the Chief Election Officer by the close of voting on Saturday, July 17, 2021 in order to be counted. It is responsibility of the voter to ensure their mail ballot is received by the deadline. A mail ballot package may be returned by any of the following methods:

VOTER REGISTRATION AND COVID 19 SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

There is no need to pre-register to vote as the registration of all electors will take place at the time of voting. Please expect COVID-19 screening, and to observe physical distancing and mask wearing requirements applicable in public places in BC, as directed by the Province. The election proceedings will follow all public health orders in place at the time of voting.

WHO MAY VOTE, AND HOW

You will be required to make a declaration that you meet the eligibility requirements as either a resident or non-resident elector, as noted below, and you will need to produce two (2) pieces of identification (at least one with a signature). Picture identification is not necessary. The identification must prove both residency and identity. You will be required to make a declaration that you meet the eligibility requirements noted below, as either a resident or non-resident elector, and you will need to produce two (2) pieces of identification (at least one with a signature). Picture identification is not necessary. The identification must prove both residency and identity.

Resident elector

- · Eighteen (18) years of age or older on voting day,
- · Canadian citizen,
- resident of BC for at least six (6) months immediately before voting day,
- resident of the Peace River Regional District, in the service area boundary (Health Related Services includes the entire PRRD, Seniors Aging in Place is all of Electoral Area D and a defined portion of Electoral Area E)
- thirty (30) days before voting day, and
- not disqualified by law from voting.

Non-resident property elector

If you own property in the Peace River Regional District and live somewhere else in B.C., you are eligible to vote as a non-resident property elector if you:

- are eighteen (18) years of age or older on voting day,
- are a Canadian citizen,
- have lived in BC for at least six (6) months before voting day.
- are the registered owner of real property in the Peace River Regional District that is within the service area boundary (Health Related Services includes the entire PRRD, Seniors Aging in Place is all of Electoral Area D and a defined portion of Electoral Area E) for at least thirty (30) days before voting day, and
- are not disqualified by law from voting.

NON-RESIDENT PROPERTY ELECTORS

Electors may vote only once for each service. If you qualify to vote as a resident and non-resident, you will vote as a resident. If you qualify to vote as a non resident, and own multiple properties, you may vote only once, regardless of the number of properties you own. Non resident voters are subject to the requirement to produce two (2) pieces of identification, and in addition, must provide proof that they are entitled to vote in relation to a property (ie: proof of ownership), and, if there is more than one registered owner of your property, written consent from the majority of the other owners will be required to authorize you to cast the one vote allowed for the property.

If voting as a Non-resident Property Elector, you are encouraged to contact the Chief Election Officer well in advance of voting day to ensure that you have all the required information prior to attending the voting place.
