STRONG COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP LEADS TO PHYSICIAN RECRUITMENT SUCCESS IN CHETWYND

Three physicians have agreed to practice in the new Chetwynd Primary Care Clinic thanks to a strong partnership between the Province of B.C., Northern Health, and the District of Chetwynd. The physicians are Dr. Venter who has elected to remain in Chetwynd, Dr. Banas who is completing his residency in the Fort St. John program and then will move to Chetwynd, and Dr. de Jager who is likely to re-join the team in Chetwynd.



"It is exciting news that three physicians have decided to set up or continue their practice in Chetwynd," said Health Minister Terry Lake. "We have made a commitment to ensuring residents of B.C. have access to primary care services, and having these three physicians practice in Chetwynd will help us recognize this goal for their community."

The announcement comes on the same day the District of Chetwynd celebrates completion of the new Chetwynd Primary Care Clinic. The new primary care clinic was built and will be maintained by the District of Chetwynd, and will be staffed by Northern Health and physicians that choose to work with an interdisciplinary team model.

"I'm very proud of the District of Chetwynd and Northern Health for working together to develop a

clinic model that would be attractive for new physicians interested in moving to Chetwynd and current practitioners,"

FIRE BAN IN PLACE FOR ENTIRE **BC NORTHEAST**

Effective on noon Wednesday, May 13th category two and three open fires will be prohibited in the Prince George Fire Centre. It's hoped the ban will prevent human caused wildfires and protect public safety.

Banned activities include the burning of stubble or grass, any fire larger than a campfire, fireworks, burn barrels, and tiki torches or similar torches.

Campfires must stay within a half metre wide, and a half metre high.

The prohibition will stay in effect until August 30, or until the public is otherwise notified.

The Prince George Fire Centre extends from the Alberta border in the east to the Skeena Mountains in the west, and includes the Peace River Regional District and the NRRM.

Covered in the prohibition are all B.C. parks, Crown lands and private lands, but it does not apply within the boundaries of a local government that has forest fire prevention bylaws in place and is serviced by a fire department.

Those in violation of the ban may face a ticket of \$345, or a fine of \$100,000 and/or one year in jail if convicted in court of starting a wildfire. Courtesy of Peace FM





said Mike Bernier, MLA for Peace River South. "Residents of Chetwynd will now see the benefits of this new model of care that is more integrated with the three physicians co-located with other health care professionals."

The new clinic will feature an inter-professional team that will support the physicians working in the facility, which will include primary care nursing, registered nurses, mental health and addiction clinicians, and home and community care support. The team will be able to provide a greater range of primary care services in Chetwynd as the medical professionals work together and draw from each of their strengths and skills. Examples of primary care include managing chronic or ongoing health needs, providing minor medical or diagnostic procedures, writing prescription requests and refills of medications, and addressing concerns regarding sexual health.

"We know physician recruitment is a challenge nationally and internationally, and we're excited to have these three physicians choose Chetwynd as the community they wish to practice," said Angela De Smit, Northern Health northeast chief operating officer. "It has been tremendous to work with the local community and local physicians on recruitment of physicians, and I am excited to celebrate this accomplishment together."

Following today's celebration at the Chetwynd Primary Care Clinic, staff and physicians will begin the process of moving into the new clinic. It is expected the clinic will be open to the public on May 25, 2015.

"I'd like to thank Dr. Venter for choosing to stay in the community, and look forward to welcoming Dr. de Jager and Dr. Banas to our wonderful community in northeast B.C.," said Merlin Nichols, District of Chetwynd Mayor. "Development of the Chetwynd Primary Care Clinic and our involvement in physician recruitment in partnership with Northern Health was the District's way of showing residents we are committed to support health care in our community. Today's announcement is confirmation that the clinic is an attractive practice model for new physicians."

Recruitment of a fourth physician to Chetwynd will occur in February 2015 when a Practice Readiness Assessment. The physician is scheduled to join the team in Chetwynd following the successful completion of this program who will have a 3 year return of service commitment to the community of Chetwynd. Northern Health has retained a full-time recruiter to help promote the practice opportunities in the northeast.

It has been a long, grueling, and sometimes exasperating experience. There have been days when I wanted just to go somewhere – anywhere, almost – and be anonymous. I wanted to forget I ever tried to do anything in Chetwynd and just *be anonymous* in the little time remaining to me. Ever felt that way?

It happens when long-sought goals appear to be thwarted by events and powers beyond one's control. It happens when interests contrary to the interests of our home town appear to interfere with achievement of our legitimate goals.

And we in Chetwynd have legitimate goals. We want to live in a stable and prosperous community. We want to ensure that our children have access to all levels of education at home or away from home. We want to be confident of available and adequate medical care into old age.

But circumstances beyond our control frequently conspire to thwart our most cherished hopes – or seem to do so. Tectonic-like pressures of money, egos, rules of operation, and deadlines build mountains of obstacles that appear insurmountable. Not always so in the end. But it's hard to see the end from the beginning – or even from the middle – being mere mortals.

As we approached the wire our tensions and blood pressures elevated dramatically. One day recently was, without exaggeration, one of the most tension-filled and difficult days in my experience. So, I am pleased to give credit where credit is due. Your Administration demonstrated the best of administrative skill and leadership in proposing solutions to problems that seemed to have no solution. Northern Health and the Doctors also demonstrated great skill in navigating the maze of very real and very good regulations that are in place to ensure dependable health care delivery.



Don't misunderstand me. I didn't write that rules were broken or regulations misapplied. Nothing of the kind. But ways were found to open the Clinic and staff it with a solid core of three physicians which, I am confident, will grow to five or six over the next months.

Now you folks who have said that we have built a clinic and have no doctors, book your appointments.
