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Patio, service area expansions support safe reopening

Government has taken action to support the province's hospitality sector by temporarily authorizing the expansion of service areas, such as patios, to support physical distancing requirements and industry recovery during the COVID-19 pandemic. "This pandemic has hit our hospitality sector hard. Our government has been working with industry on ways to support the more than 180,000 British Columbians who work in pubs, restaurants and other parts of the sector," said David Eby, Attorney General. "Speeding up the process will help restaurants, pubs, breweries and other licensees, and give British Columbians more options for safely eating out this summer, while continuing to follow Dr. Henry's directions." To support businesses in their reopening efforts, the Liquor and Cannabis Regulation branch (LCRB) will now permit food-primary, liquor-primary and manufacturer licensees, such as wineries, breweries and distilleries, to apply through a simplified online process to temporarily expand their service areas until Oct. 31, 2020. The temporary authorizations are focused on expanding a licensed service area's footprint only and will not permit an increase in an establishment's overall occupancy. Licensees must comply with all local bylaws and liquor-primary and manufacturer licensees must also receive the approval of their local government. There are no fees associated with the temporary expansion applications, which will be reviewed in the order they are received using an expedited approval process for faster processing times. While there will not be a site inspection prior to approval of the permit, inspectors will conduct regular compliance inspections. "This is excellent news that will be welcomed by all of our members and by businesses throughout B.C.," said Ian Tostenson, president and CEO, B.C. Restaurant and Foodservices Association. "This pandemic has created unprecedented challenges for all of us, and it has been invaluable for government and industry to work together as they have, as we take these important steps toward recovery. We thank the Province for its significant efforts and look forward to rebuilding together."

Local businesses are coming back from the pandemic shutdown in every part of the Peace.

It's great to see the entrepreneurial spirit that is driving this reopening. Owners and operators have gone through one of the toughest couple of months that small businesses and employers have faced in almost a century. So many of them faced a complete shutdown because of COVID-19. They struggled to stay afloat through the pandemic and their closure. Now they are looking to adapt to the new normal so they can get people back on the job and welcome customers back.

It's a daunting task. There are new rules on social distancing, cleaning, and public safety to be implemented. And then there is the simple day-to-day challenge of meeting a payroll and managing a business.

I'll keep pushing the government to find a way to deliver better answers to our small and medium-sized local businesses.

We also have the chance, as a community, to get behind our local businesses. It is why I'm working with colleagues from the City of Dawson Creek, Community Futures Peace Liard, Dawson Creek Chamber of Commerce, and Lake View Credit Union on the Dawson Creek Business Resilience Team. We're constantly exploring ways to help local businesses get people back on the job and back in stores.

We're also encouraging everyone who can to shop local – something that will be a key part of the new normal. Every dollar spent close to home helps support a neighbour, helps support local services, and helps build a stronger community. Make your next purchase at the store instead of online. Support a local restaurant by ordering take out – or dining in if they're set up for that. Each of us can play a key role in the economic recovery.

The last week of May is National Tourism Week. Long trips are still not going to be part of this. Instead, it's a great time to be a part of the recovery by being a tourist at home – patronize a local business, buy a gift card, and safely explore open facilities close to home.
