CHETWYND PREPARES FOR FLOOD SEASON

I spoke with Chetwynd's Chief Administrative Officer, Carol for some details on how preparations are going to ready ourselves for rainiest season in Chetwynd. She started by explaining that the storm drains are easily holding the snow run-off this year as snow pack is only at 95% for Chetwynd this year, even though it felt like winter lasted forever. The District of Chetwynd stockpiled on supplies just in case we see some heavy rain this year by purchasing 40,000 sand bags. Available to those who live in town and also for areas around Chetwynd.

Carol also mentioned that recommendations came back from Urban System's Flood Hazard Assessment Study that took place last spring/summer. It suggested a few things to improve on, those few improvements and with the help of a list of heavy equipment operators on call for emergency situations, Carol says Chetwynd is fairly prepared in the event of a repeat of 2016. She also mentioned that Chetwynd is in close touch with BC's Emergency Preparedness Committee to keep informed. The District of Chetwynd has also applied for a \$750,000 grant to help complete the rest of the recommendations from Urban System's Study, which they should hear back about soon.

B.C. GOVERNMENT MAKING AMENDMENT TO KEEP BIG MONEY OUT OF LOCAL ELECTIONS

A change has been made to the Local Election Campaign Financing Act regulations to ensure that union and corporate donations cannot be used to fund any expenses of elector organizations during the year of a general local election.

"This change will ensure that we have a level playing field for candidates by keeping big money out of local elections," said Selina Robinson, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing. "The amendment we brought into effect today recognizes that operational expenses and election expenses are hard to distinguish during an election year. This is a targeted change, to ensure elector organizations understand operational expenses will now be treated as election expenses in an election year."

The regulation increases the scope of what are defined as election expenses for "continuing" elector organizations. Under the previous rules, some operational expenses of elector organizations were not considered election expenses, leading to concerns about the influence of donors with deep pockets. This change will ensure that corporate and union donations cannot be used to influence elections.

These amendments are in effect for the 2018 general local elections in October, and will also apply to board of education elections.

Quick Facts:

An elector organization is any organization that files documents with a local government to endorse candidates in a particular local election. Elector organizations are often referred to as civic political parties.

Elector organizations are distinct from provincial political parties, as some may only exist to endorse candidates for a particular local election, while others may operate on a continuing basis between local elections.

Elector organizations are subject to different rules than provincial political parties (e.g., elector organizations do not register or file annual financial reports with Elections BC).

This regulation focuses on elector organizations that operate on a continuing basis between local elections.

The Local Elections Campaign Financing Act was amended in 2016 to implement expense limits for local elections, and in fall 2017 to ban corporate, union, and out-of-province donations and put limits on individual campaign contributions.

The application, monitoring and enforcement of campaign finance rules is the role of Elections BC. Elections BC's role is to administer the new campaign finance rules for local elections fairly for all participants, and to help political participants understand the new rules.

Questions on how campaign financing rules apply to specific situations should be directed to Elections BC, the agency responsible for compliance and enforcement.

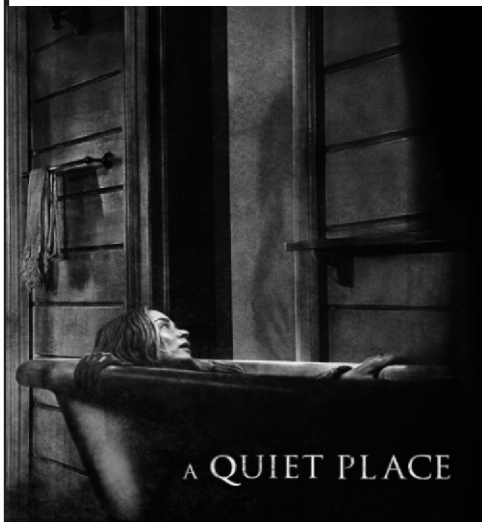

Provincial Government Sets Guidelines on Marijuana Legalization

With legalization on the horizon, some of the many questions have finally been answered by Legislative Bureau Chief Keith Baldrey, last Thursday, April 26th.

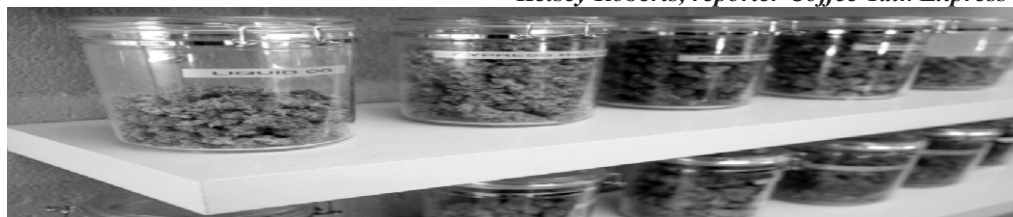
The legal age to purchase, sell or consume cannabis will be set at 19 years old and will allow adults to carry 30 grams of cannabis in a public place. In addition, adults will be allowed to grow up to 4 plants as long as they are not visible from public spaces off the property. The rules will be the same as for smoking tobacco and vaping in public areas, prohibiting use near playgrounds and sport fields, and with 10 metres of buildings.

Although originally the federal government proposed July 1 as the legalization date, it has since been held off and the new date is undetermined, some saying at the end of summer.

The new legislation introduced created The Cannabis Control and Licensing Act, giving the provincial government exclusive rights to sell in stand alone government or privately owned stores. An amendment to the Motor Vehicle Act was made with changes to suspensions and restrictions that will help deal with drivers under the influence. The Cannabis Distribution Act which will provide the provincial government jurisdiction over wholesale distribution and authority over public retail sales.

More information will be known and rules will be set as federal legalization nears, but these guidelines put into place will help to prioritize children's health and safety first and foremost. Note that the consumption of recreational marijuana will still be illegal even if this legislature passes, until the federal government legalizes.

MORE CONSERVATION OFFICERS COMING TO NORTHEAST BC

The provincial government has announced that twenty new conservation officers, three of whom will be coming to Northeast BC, were sworn in Victoria. The officers, upon successful completion of training, will be based in various locations in the province, including Chetwynd and Mackenzie, where newly created positions will be filled. The additional conservation officers will bring the province's total to 60. In a statement, Environment Minister George Heyman announced that resources are being added to locations with the greatest need. The officers will work on a zone-coverage basis, which will allow the officers to respond to complaints and concerns that occur within their zone.

LEGISLATION WILL PROHIBIT PAYMENT FOR BLOOD AND PLASMA COLLECTION

Health Minister Adrian Dix introduced the Voluntary Blood Donations Act, which will help preserve the integrity of Canada's public blood and plasma collection system by preventing payment for blood and plasma collection in British Columbia.

"Our voluntary blood donation system is an integral resource that helps save lives thanks to people who graciously donate," said Dix. "We are taking action to prevent payment for blood and plasma collection, and to make sure that the donations people give benefit people in our province and Canada."

No paid plasma collection clinics are operating in British Columbia. This legislation is meant to prevent such operations from being established, by making it illegal to pay, offer to pay, or advertise that they will pay someone for blood or plasma. This is similar to legislation in Alberta, Ontario and Québec.

Currently in Canada, there are private for-profit organizations paying individuals for plasma, and then selling that plasma on the global market. By preventing these businesses from operating in B.C., this legislation will ensure that blood and plasma collected in B.C. stay as part of the national supply system run by Canadian Blood Services (CBS). As the national blood and plasma supplier, CBS is exempt from the legislation, as are the provincial government and medical researchers.

"This is an issue that is very important to me and people around B.C.," said Judy Darcy, Minister of Mental Health and Addictions. "Our government stands with public health care, and that means keeping the blood supply system a public resource."

"Canadian Blood Services welcomes efforts to help further strengthen Canada's voluntary, non-remunerated, publicly funded and accountable collections model," said Dr. Graham D. Sher, chief executive officer of Canadian Blood Services. "British Columbia has a long and proud history of support for the national system, and we are pleased to see this recognition of the outstanding contributions of the many donors and volunteers in the province."

"This legislation will help protect the health and well-being of the many British Columbians who rely on our voluntary blood and plasma collection system," said Rick Turner, BC Health Coalition co-chair. "Making sure that the blood and plasma collected in B.C. stays in Canada is good for Canadian patients and good for the public health-care system."

The Ministry of Health will initiate investigations into any person or company paying, offering to pay, or advertising that they will pay someone for their blood or plasma. Fines for individuals found to be in contravention of the act will be up to \$10,000 for the first offence, and up to \$50,000 for subsequent offences. For companies, the maximum fine will be \$100,000 for the first offence, and \$500,000 for each subsequent offence.

CBS was founded in 1998, and manages the national supply of blood, blood products and stem cells, as well as related services, for all the provinces and territories except Québec. This legislation will assist CBS in protecting its voluntary donor base from competition by private companies.

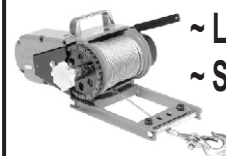
