NORTHERN HEALTH AND DISTRICT OF CHETWYND COLLABORATING ON SUSTAINABLE HEALTH CARE PLANNING

The District of Chetwynd and Northern Health are actively working on a physician recruitment strategy, and the opening of a new primary care clinic and strong promotion of the community are the keys.

"The goal of the strategy is to ensure sustainability of health care services in the community in the long-term, while meeting the needs of the community while recruiting new physicians," said Peace River South MLA Mike Bernier. "I'm pleased to see the community helping lead the recruitment of physicians to Chetwynd which will lead to long-term sustainability of health services."

Examples of successful community partnership leading to physician recruitment include Fort St. James and Mackenzie.

"As Chair of Council's Health Services Committee, I know that a lot of work is going on behind the scenes to ensure that Chetwynd maintains a full complement of Physician services for our community," said Ernest Pfanner, District of Chetwynd Councillor. "We have forged an important relationship with Northern Health staff, who are working diligently to create a new health care delivery model for Chetwynd. In regards to new physicians we expect to



HOW TO TRAIN YOUR DRAGON 2

MEET THE MAYOR

To be or not to be; to do or not to do? These are questions that precede discussions and decisions of the greatest import, discussions and decisions that affect the bottom line of Chetwynd's accounting records; discussions and decisions that lead up to the construction of a new clinic or city hall or to funding for any number of events that contribute to the good life we enjoy here. These are questions that Council asks every happy day. They are not taken lightly.

Should Council be what Council was elected to be – the representatives of the people of Chetwynd? Should Council continue to be responsible with the funds the local government receives in taxes, fees, and grants? Or should Council depend on the adrenalin of delegations or call for a public vote on every issue?

Would you be happy if Council were unduly influenced by delegations of citizens with special interests? Or should Council receive the delegation recognizing that Council is, by virtue of being elected, the visible expression and moral image of public opinion in Chetwynd for this term?

I don't want you to infer that Council is unwilling to listen to public representations or that we do not welcome delegations of special interest. Council is willing to listen; we do welcome delegations and will weigh carefully the information they present. But Council has an obligation to the electorate to place all information within the big picture of Chetwynd as seen by Council. (It is true, however, that a well-crafted and well-presented delegation may serve to alter the picture. It has happened before and it could happen again.)

There has been a bit of agitation in recent weeks about Council's position on funding the exciting and fantastic annual chainsaw sculpturing event (some of you are aware of this; some are not). This is one of the events that sets Chetwynd apart from other communities and gives us a place in the world that other communities would love to have. Kudos to the organizers, sponsors, and volunteers.

The District of Chetwynd Council has committed 40,000 of your tax dollars to this event for 2015 (well, guess what; this is about \$40 per every tax-paying resident of Chetwynd – more or less). Of taxation revenue this amount represents only 1.6%. As a portion of total revenues it is about 0.8%. As a Council, we think \$40,000 is a significant chunk of your change, for all of which we could find other uses. And the chainsaw sculpturing event is important to the image Chetwynd is carving of itself. We would be loath to see it abandoned.

But this is not the whole story. It must cost \$60,000 to \$80,000 per year to maintain the sculptures when the chainsaws are silent and the sculptors have gone home with the prizes.

Council is committed to working out a master plan to address not only financial support for the event but also a rational approach to dealing with the product.



The new primary care clinic is being built and maintained by the District of Chetwynd, and will be staffed by Northern Health and physicians that choose to relocate to the community.

An interprofessional team will support the physicians working in the facility, which will include primary care nursing, registered nurses, mental health and addiction clinicians, and home and community care support.

"Physicians have a choice of where they wish to practice, and physicians setting up their practice in smaller communities gravitate towards primary care clinics with interdisciplinary teams," said Angela De Smit, Northern Health's chief operating officer for the northeast. "It is our goal to create the practice environment that is inviting to a physician, and in Chetwynd have been able to do so with a great partnership with the district."

There are currently four practice opportunities for physicians in Chetwynd. Northern Health has retained a full-time recruiter to help promote the practice opportunities in the northeast.

MP ZIMMER TABLES PRIVATE MEMBERS' MOTION ON THE UN FIREARMS REGIME

Bob Zimmer, Member of Parliament for Prince George-Peace River, has tabled his Private Members' Motion, M-589. The motion highlights Canada's extensive firearms safety regulations and discourages the government from adopting the United Nations resolution 55/255 concerning firearms.

M-589 states: That, in the opinion of the House: (a) Canada already exceeds all the standards listed in United Nations resolution 55/255 concerning firearms (the resolution); (b) the regulations envisioned in the resolution would do nothing to enhance public safety, and would serve only to burden the law-abiding firearms community; and therefore, the government has already surpassed its obligations with respect to the resolution and is not required to take any further steps.

The UN resolution includes a section on the marking of firearms, asking State Parties to have each imported firearm marked with an identification code, identifying the country of import. This would mean that all firearms imported into Canada would have to be marked with 'Canada' or 'CA', creating a huge cost to the law-abiding firearms community.

"Canada's common sense firearms regulations are already extensive and exceed what the United Nations is asking in this resolution," said Mr. Zimmer. "We have our own Canadian approach, and I have serious concerns with adding yet another layer of unnecessary red tape for our law-abiding firearms community."

Current Canadian laws already require that all firearms be uniquely identified, including bearing a permanently marked serial number or unique firearms identification number.

"Adding yet another marking on a firearm will do nothing for public safety," said Mr. Zimmer. "If implemented, this marking regime would only drive up the costs for law-abiding firearms owners, or drive down the gun market, affecting small business owners throughout Canada."

"We have already seen how the wasteful and ineffective long-gun registry did nothing to stop crime," said Mr. Zimmer. "My concern is that implementing this resolution would create a back-door registry and my intention in tabling this motion is to ensure that any door that could re-open the long-gun registry remains firmly closed."
