MATT'S MUSINGS

March 21 will bring the first day of Spring, regardless of what the weather forecast is, and as always it brings change. Bears end their hibernation, birds begin their migration back north and the trees start budding, signalling a return to warm weather. Having a Persian wife has taught me that the first day of spring is also Persian New Year, or Nowruz (pronounced "no-rooz"), which translates literally as "New Day." I've come to appreciate the idea of the new year starting on the first day of spring, as the current method of measuring the passage of years through the Gregorian Calendar seems far more arbitrary. How many times have you decided to make a significant life change via a New Year's resolution only to find yourself resorting to your old habits before the end of January? I think this has a lot to do with the timing of the New Year. The Christmas holidays are a time of indulgence and excess, for treats not enjoyed at any other time of year and of lavishing gifts on family and friends. This is a good thing, but attempting to overcorrect the necessary indulgences of the holiday season with an abrupt about-face a few days later seems counterintuitive.

Any life change that is to last must be committed to, and rushing hastily in the opposite direction that you spent the previous weeks enjoying is a recipe for disaster. Deciding to suddenly hit the gym after weeks of feasting and drinking is more likely to result in a gym membership that you're not using rather than a brand new physique. Instead, I recommend thinking of the first day of spring as the start of your new year. Are there things in your life that you've been putting off? Is there something you've been wanting to do, or something you've been wanting to say to someone? A new and improved version of yourself can happen at any time of year with the right conviction, but I appreciate the symbolism inherent in the changing of winter to spring. All of nature experiences dramatic changes when the snow begins to melt, but human beings are the only ones who decide to mark the passage of time in the middle of the coldest, darkest months.

Everyone has things about themselves that they wish they could change, and the coming of spring is the ideal time to set plans in motion to make those changes happen. Our time on this planet is very limited in the grand scheme of things, and no one ever looks back at the end of their life happy that they never took the initiative to realize their dreams. The best life you can live is one that is free of regrets, so lose the weight, gain some confidence, find a better job or take that vacation you've always dreamed of. Whatever it is that you've always put off for another day that may never come unless you make it happen. Some goals will take longer to realize than others, but as the philosopher Lao Tzu famously said, "the journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step." From curing diseases and putting a man on the moon to getting healthier and being happier with yourself, whatever can be accomplished begins simply with the idea that it *can* be done. Persians traditionally undergo a major spring cleaning in advance of the new year, something that always helps rejuvenate your surroundings. Give your house a good onceover this weekend, and think about the person you want to become. And Happy New Year!



DAWSON CREEK AND FORT ST. JOHN TURN 2015 WORLD UNDER-17 HOCKEY CHALLENGE INTO GOLD



Team Canada White may have captured the on-ice prize at the 2015 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge, but the off-ice gold-medal winners were the Peace Region and the legacy funding benefactors in the communities of Dawson Creek and Fort St. John.

The eight-day tournament, hosted at the Encana Events Centre and North Peace Arena, attracted more than 30,000 fans over 26 games. A capacity crowd of 4,258 was on-hand at the Encana Events Centre to witness Team Canada White secure the first gold medal for a Canadian representative since 2011 - marking the event's third-highest attendance figures in the last five years.

"The overwhelming success of the 2015 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge is especially impressive given the host communities had just under six months to prepare and execute on

this growing international event," noted

community co-chairs Wally Ferris and Barry Reynard. "Our host committee is proud to announce that the communities of Dawson Creek and Fort St. John will share in a legacy of close to \$120,000 stemming from the proceeds of the event, and an additional \$50,000 from 50/50 proceeds will go to minor hockey associations in the two communities."

Ferris and Reynard added that a number of factors contributed to the financial success of the event, including community support of ticket sales, strong support of the business community, provincial and municipal funding, and the incredible commitment from volunteers and local stakeholders.

"The benefits to our community have been substantial. It was only with the overwhelming support of our citizens who stepped up to dedicate countless volunteer hours, and our many corporate sponsors, that this was even possible," said City of Fort St. John Acting Mayor, Dan Davies. "We are grateful for their support and we look forward to hosting more world-class events."

An economic impact study conducted during the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge in partnership with Tourism Dawson Creek and the Canadian Sport Tourism Alliance concluded that the combined spending of operations and visitors to the 2015 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge totalled close to \$6 million in economic activity for the Peace Region and the province of British Columbia.

Dawson Creek mayor, Dale Bumstead echoed the sentiments of Acting Mayor Davies: "This event has been remarkable for northeastern British Columbia. A compressed timeframe to execute this tournament was no small feat, but the impact and outcome has been exceptional. I am proud of what we have accomplished."






