COUNCIL MEETING SEPTEMBER 19TH

There was a full house in attendance at Monday's council meeting at the town hall. The meeting began with a presentation by Fire Chief Leo Sabulsky regarding the upcoming changes to the 911 dispatch system. At this point all 911 fire calls go to Prince George, are then directed to Dawson and then to Chetwynd. Although the system has been working fine up until this point, their contract is expiring next year and they have not submitted a bid to continue service, as of now. Right now, 3 companies are bidding for the job. The PRRD (Peace River Regional District) will make the final decision next month on who will provide the service.

The next presentation was by Mark Bartkoski, President of Conuma Coal. His presentation was the reason for the packed house with news about the Brule and Wolverine coal mines being opened. He began by explaining the background of his partners and himself before going into the plans for the mines. He also made a point of telling everyone in attendance the new and somewhat different vision that he and his partners see for the future of the mine. With no plans of camps, and the mines hiring a fraction of the people it previously had, the mines will be smaller, closer knit operations. The plan for these mines is to make them a long term venture, sustainable even in the lulls of the coal market.

The Brule mine operation has already hired 50 people from Chetwynd and Tumbler Ridge, and is expecting another 100+ to be hired within the next 6 weeks. After the Brule mine is up and running they expect to have the Wolverine mine starting operations in roughly 3-8 months. At that time the Tumbler Ridge residents will be transferred to the Wolverine mine, making them closer to home. There are no plans at this time for opening the Willow Creek Mine.

The meeting ended shortly after, with council voting to nominate Councillor Bassendowski as the BCHvdro Peace River/ Williston Resevoir Advisory Committee. They also voted to appoint Helene Weightman as the Little Prairie Forest Inc. Board of Directors to replace the retiring Don Hicks.

MEET THE MAYOR

September 23, 2016

Last Friday I had the satisfaction of representing our home town in Prince George at the Northern Mayors' and RD Board Chairs' Roundtable with 59 other mostly Mayors and RD Board Chairs plus a smattering of CAOs dispatched to keep their Mayors in check – one in particular who had difficulty expressing his truly cogent thoughts without colorful and creative expletives.

Three main topics guided our discussion: Economic Development, Social Responsibility, and Environmental Stewardship. With these topics to focus our brain power, you can imagine that the discussion ranged from pro to con and from left to right with many in the middle ground and not a few actually quietly absorbing the noise of the others. Yet it was all civil and lacking in name calling, accusation, and dart practice.

Five vocal representatives from our great North East ensured that viewpoints from this side of the rocks were not overlooked. Yet, even from the NE we did not express eye-to-eye perspectives on everything.

I seem to be a blend of left, right, and centre on many issues. I support economic development within reason and at the same time I recognize and support the alleviation of social concerns. I am convinced that many of the social issues that plague most communities (affordable housing, education opportunities, home care, homelessness, and you fill in the rest of the blanks) can be linked however tenuously to the lack of economic security that could be provided by a steady job that pays a living wage. Hence, my support for such enterprises as the pellet and the cogeneration plants that have recently been commissioned in Chetwynd. Hence, my support for the forest industry, the transportation industry, for mining, agriculture, and other efforts to wrest a living from rock, soil, and wind.

Yes, and my support for reasonable regulations that maintain the integrity of our environment. There are not many good folk in Chetwynd whose connection to the environment goes back as far and as intimately as mine. A few, yes, but not many. I remember when the lakes and the streams were pure and we drank straight from their pristine waters. I remember when the skies swarmed with birds above the waters and the air was filled with their music.

Things have changed over the decades and this change is not all as a result of smoking industry. Human population pressure has enormous impact on every facet of the environment. Agriculture puts its own signature on these hills and valleys as well as on the waterways of home. I could cite specifics.

But we have to live and every family must have an income to supply its bread and water.

And while we court the opportunities to locate employment in our vicinity, we also understand that not every person is equipped to

take advantage of these opportunities. We have obligations to these members of our community. We need to lobby government to provide the training that will equip local residents to take the jobs that may be created.

The housing issue cannot be overlooked. Some communities have experienced crises in housing when property owners, taking advantage of emerging opportunities, increased costs to renters and home buyers to the extent that people were forced onto the street – not a situation that we can tolerate in our home town. We need solutions that recognize the rights of property owners and that protect the right of everyone to have a roof and four walls.

I haven't even touched on the depth of passion and caring that was expressed in our conversation. Every community is experiencing major challenges. Let's keep going forward with open eyes all the time recognizing that events far away may come here to bite us. *Merlin Nichols, Mayor*

KELSEY'S CHRONICLE

With school back in full swing, behavioural changes in your kids is something every parent should look out for. This could be worrisome when a child comes home with a deflated sense of self. Knowing the right questions to ask can be the start to fixing the problem, as well as recognizing the signs of bullying.

The affects of bullying can show up in several ways, from changes in eating and sleeping habits and frequent stomach or head aches, to unexplained injuries, lost or stolen things, or simply the avoidance of social situations. These specific things could mean your child is dealing with a bully. By knowing the right questions to ask, you could help make the first step in the right direction. Children can be embarrassed that they are being teased at school, and sometimes its hard telling a grown up because of the fear of a back lash or not being taken seriously.

The first thing is to let your child know that their feelings are valid and that bullies should always be pointed out to an adult. Asking questions like- what were some good things that happened in your day, and did anything bad happen? Who do you sit with at lunch and what do you talk about? What's your friends name(s) and what do you like best about them? What are you good at and what do you like best about yourself? All of these questions can help your child just open up about their school day, which we all know how hard that is!

Not only is bullying a traumatic experience that a lot of kids deal with, it is also something that a lot of parents like to think is a regular part of childhood. In fact, it can have detrimental psychological affects later on in life for not only the kids who are bullied, but for the kids who are also "the bullies." Low self esteem, depression, poor school performance, and anxiety disorders are some instant affects, sometimes escalating into suicidal thoughts and actions later on. Bullying should always be taken seriously by teachers, parents and peers.

The face of bullying comes in several different forms, physical and verbal - kicking, hitting, name calling and intimidation, which are the typical forms of bullying that most of us know about. But did you know about social and emotional bullying like humiliating or embarrassing someone, leaving someone out, spreading rumours, mimicking, or playing mean tricks? Then there is the more recent cyber bullying which is a mix of all forms of bullying but on social media. Cyber bullying tends to be more severe verbally, with an unjustified sense of self, as the bully hides behind a computer/cellphone screen.

Have the talk with your kids, younger and older, and make them realize that the choices they make will stay with them forever. Just like the ol' toothpaste trick, give your kids a tube of toothpaste and make them squeeze it all out... then tell them to put all the toothpaste back in the tube. Impossible, right? That's what it's like when you say hurtful things... you can't take them back!

Words can hurt, but they can also stop bullying in its tracks by notifying a parent or teacher or simply standing up to the bully by yourself or with the help of friends. Be kind always, because after all everyone is dealing with things that we don't know about.

COURT OF APPEAL RULES AGAINST PEACE VALLEY LANDOWNER ASSOCIATION

Bc's highest court has ruled against the Peace Valley Landowner Association in the fight against the Site C project. The main issue the Association has with the project is it's environmental assessment certificate and it's 4 "recommendations."

The Canadian Environmental Assessment Agency and the British Columbia Environmental Assessment Agency Office had made BC Hydro provide an Environmental Impact Statement to show the need, purpose, technical and economic alternatives and benefits of the project, which was completed in 2012. Since then, the statement has been modified, re-submitted and a panel had produced it's report in May of 2014.

It was ruled that these 'recommendations' were not seen as recommendations and should not affect the issuing of the certificate, but they could be considered by the government after the certificate is issued. This means that ministers did not need to consider the recommendations when they decided to issue the environmental certificate. *Courtesy of Peace FM*
