Tenders are being requested for the construction of a Parks Garage to be located at 5458 56th Street NW, Chetwynd, BC VOC 1J0

Sealed tenders must include design, specs and pricing for the garage. The deadline for submission is on or before March 31, 2020 at 12:00pm.

The successful contractor will be responsible to provide drawings and obtain construction permits. The timeline for construction is from May, 2020 with completion before the end of July, 2020.

The garage dimensions are 30'x32'x12' to maximum of 30'x 40'x 12' with no centre posts to ensure an open floor area; must have single side door and roll up doors to maximum width of 2 10' x 12' each with 2 in the front / 2 in the back and a minimum of 2 windows. The structure must also be designed to meet the District of Chetwynd Development Permit Area guidelines.

The garage is required to be insulated and have electricity installed on the interior and exterior which includes outdoor motion lighting. The front must have roll up doors to accommodate entry of and easy access to large equipment. The inside of the garage must also have protected board or material 4' from the floor. The roof will be 12' high with a peaked roof design. Colours will be determined by District of Chetwynd with design specs. The floor will be cement finish.

Statement from the West Moberly First Nations Chief and Council Regarding COVID-19

This notice is being sent not to create or amplify panic, but as an advisory for band members and community members in order to better protect themselves, their families and the community at large. In order to reduce contact, all nonessential services have been shut down. WMFN Chief and Council are actively monitoring the Covid-19 situation in BC, have implemented a response plan, and are diligently working on the continued health and safety of the WMFN's community. A Community Isolation and Community Access policy has been developed and implemented. At this time, we are **asking all members to please stay home and not come to the Health Center or Main office to limit the spread. Please call instead.**

Our response team is working with the Provincial and Federal Government to share information and assess potential health risk. WMFN's Pandemic Plan is being updated as new information comes in and we are confident that we are taking proactive measures to minimize risk and keep WMFN safe. The Response team will be active in the community providing information to anyone who has guestions regarding COVID-19. On-going updates will be shared throughout the coming weeks. Please follow on the WMFN Events page on Facebook for information regarding the COVID-19 response. Currently WMFN has a low chance of contracting COVID-19. This may change with the Virus spreading rapidly. "The Microsoft Scam" Revised

I get a lot of users coming in with a very similar issue: "I'm stuck on a screen that tells me my computer has multiple issues/viruses and to call the number listed in order to resolve the issue". For all intents and purposes they are not able to close this screen, and do not seem to be able to do anything about it.

This is generally referred to as "The Microsoft Scam" however, Microsoft has nothing to do with it. These are scammers and if you call this number they may run you through a series of bogus "diagnostics", with the initial intent of allowing them to remotely access your computer and the end result of stealing your money and information. They will quote you outrageous prices to fix problems that may not exist in the first place. If denied and left unchecked on your PC, these scammers have been known to cause extensive damage, from deleting data, to locking you out of your own system via "Syslock" (requires a password before Windows even has the opportunity to boot).

What the average user does not understand, is that this problem can be averted by closing the browser. In most cases, this doesn't seem possible, perhaps there is no close button, or there is a pesky pop up that needs to be addressed before being able to do anything with three browser. Sometimes you can right click the offending browser's icon on the task bar and select "close window" but more often than not you will have to use the "Task Manager" (CTRL+SHIFT+ESC)

The Task Manager can be opened by right-clicking the task bar and selecting task manager or by the key combination CTRL+SHIFT+ESC. You will search the list of running applications for either Chrome, Firefox, Microsoft Edge etc. and select "End Task". The next time you open your browser it would be wise to clear your browser history. If you have anti-virus, its not a bad idea to run a scan as well., you can never be too safe.
