CHETWYND COUNCIL MEETING

Chetwynd City Council held their regular meeting on Monday, March 21, and first on the agenda was a presentation by Toni Ethier on behalf of Chetwynd Circus North. She spoke of the benefits the program brings to the children who participate and the efforts they're undergoing to seek funding to ensure the program remains successful. A request was made to the council for a grant of \$2000, which the council agreed to discuss. Following that was a presentation by Dave Conway of BC Hydro, who offered an update on the progress of the Site C project. He emphasized their commitment to safety and minimizing construction-related impacts on residents, businesses, property owners, communities and Aboriginal groups surrounding Site C. Significant work is already underway to ready the site for the main civil works contractor in 2016. Construction began in 2015 and is expected to be completed by 2024, and currently includes approximately 650 workers (450 from B.C.), a number that will increase over the coming years after the completion of the 1600-person worker camp. Conway also discussed the variety of contracts that have been awarded and will be awarded in the future, with the largest being the \$1.75 billion contract awarded to Peace River Hydro Partners for the main civil works, which comprises the majority of the earthworks required to construct the project. Regarding local opportunities, he noted that Chetwynd's Paul Paquette & Son's are among the contractors working on the project and that the recent job fairs held in Chetwynd and several surrounding communities were a huge success.

Two bylaws that require updates every five years were passed: Official Community Plan Bylaw No. 1030, 2016 and Zoning Bylaw No. 1035, 2016. The Official Community Plan Bylaw is extensive but has goals that include correlating land use planning with the best interest of the community in mind, provide better cultural, recreational and educational facilities, diversifying the local economic base and upgrade the road systems and municipal water and sewer infrastructure. The Zoning Bylaw provides rules and regulations regarding local land use in a manner that ensures "orderly, economic, beneficial, equitable and environmentally sensitive use, development and redevelopment" with the District of Chetwynd. The new bylaws have not been uploaded

to the District website yet but anyone interested in the full details should contact the District for more information.

MONEY TO BURN

Why Did The K Foundation Burn a Million Pounds of Cash?

K Foundation burning a million quid was an action that took place on August 23, 1994, in which the K Foundation, which was an art duo consisting of Bill Drummond and Jimmy Cauty, burned one million pounds in cash on the Scottish island of Jura. Bill Drummond and Jimmy Cauty are well known as the pop group The KLF. The KLF was one of the United Kingdom's most successful pop acts during the early 1990s. They were the biggest selling singles act in the world for 1991. In 1992, the band stopped recording music and Drummond and Cauty formed the K Foundation. The foundation served as an artistic outlet for the duo's post-retirement KLF income. Between 1993 and 1995, the duo spent their money in a number of ways, including on a series of press adverts and wild subversions in the art world, with a strong focus on the Turner Prize. However, the most unusual event occurred when the K Foundation burned one million pounds of cash. The money took well over an hour to burn as Drummond and Cauty fed £50 notes into the fire. According to Drummond. only about £900,000 of the money was actually burnt, with the remainder heading straight up the chimney.

The pair has never fully explained their motivation for burning the money. In 1995, the group announced a 23 year moratorium on all projects. They indicated that they would not respond to questions about the burning of the cash until 2018. The incineration was recorded on a Hi-8 video camera by K Foundation collaborator Gimpo. In 1995 the footage was used in a documentary titled Watch the K Foundation Burn a Million Quid. The K Foundation toured the film around the UK. In most cases, Drummond and Cauty would engage the audience in debate about the burning of the money and its meaning. A book recounting the event was released in 1997. It contains stills from the film, accounts of the events, and viewer reactions. The book also contains an image of a single house brick that was manufactured from the fire's ashes. Bill Drummond spoke about the burning in 2000 and 2004. At first he was unrepentant, but in 2004, he admitted to the BBC that he regretted burning the money. Many people have reported that the K Foundation have no solid answers as to why they burned the money and what the act represented. It is truly one of the most peculiar stories ever reported.



EASTER EGGSTRAVAGANZA

Dozens of kids hopped on over to the Chetwynd Rec Centre on Wednesday, March 23 for the Easter Eggstravaganza filled with fun, games and a serious sugar rush. The event featured complimentary carrot "Bunny Juice" for everyone and lots of games to enjoy while they waited for their age-specific event to begin. Games included a ring toss where children attempted to throw hula hoops over the ears of giant bunny rabbits as well as "bunny hop" sack races and egg-balancing races. For the creatively-inclined there was an egg decorating station as well as a cookie decorating station with pastel-coloured icing and tables dedicated to colouring Easter-themed art. Although a few of the smallest children seemed a bit afraid, there was also an actual Easter Bunny roaming around with extra chocolate treats for the brave.

The main event were the various Easter egg hunts divided into different age groups. The day began with the 0-4 years group crawling and toddling around looking for as many eggs as they could, with some requiring a little

assistance from their parents. The 5-7 age group was given a more difficult challenge in the form of a scavenger hunt alongside their search for eggs, and had to search for five clues that related to an Easter song, which turned out to be "Little Bunny Foo Foo." The final hunt for the 8-12 year olds upped the difficulty even more, turning out the lights and requiring the flashlight-wielding kids to search for halves of Easter eggs. They had to match each half with another half of the same colour, and once they had five eggs they could claim their prize. All children received an age-appropriate amount of chocolate and a free video rental from Wildcat Video. The smiles and memories from the event will last long after the sugar high has worn off.



UPDATED INFORMATION ON MISSING TEEN

Fifteen year old Denny Poole was last seen on March 12, 2016 around 7:30 p.m. on the hill on the south side of the Kiskatinaw River Bridge on Highway 97 between Dawson Creek and Fort St John.

On March 20th, RCMP Air Services helicopter was brought in to assist in the search along with local Search and Rescue personnel.

Since Denny was last seen, he has had no contact with his family which is considered out of character for him not to call a family member.


Investigators do not believe foul play is involved so far in their investigation, but at this point are turning to the public to assist them with two very key issues in their investigation.

Police are attempting to develop a time line approximately 24 hours prior to Denny last being seen on Highway 97. Any motorists who were travelling between Dawson Creek and Fort St John who may have seen two youths on the highway or side roads with one of them fitting Denny's description, please call.

Secondly, around 7:30 p.m, Denny and the other youth split up and went their own ways. At 7:52 p.m, RCMP dispatch received a phone call from the second youth to report what police call a suspicious occurrence, but the youth may have experienced a hypothermic delusion. During the call, an unknown man who is travelling between Dawson Creek and Fort St John, stops to check on the well-being of the youth and begins taking with the RCMP dispatcher on the youth's phone. The individual spoke with what sounded like a heavy South Asian accent. Police have not been

able to identify this individual and are asking for help, or the person to come forward to assist police.

Staff/Sgt. Marcel Guilbault Dawson Creek RCMP Commander added Since Denny was



on foot and appeared to have been wandering in the area for some time, we are asking everyone in the area where he was last seen to check their property and outbuildings in case Denny took refuge in one of these structures.
