UPGRADED USED OIL RECYCLING FACILITY OPENS IN CHETWYND

BC Used Oil Management Association ("BCUOMA"), a not-for-profit group dedicated to the collection and recycling of lubricating oil, oil filters, oil containers, antifreeze and antifreeze containers in British Columbia, today announced that the Chetwynd Recycling & Bottle Depot located at 4824 54th street NW, Chetwynd, BC, has upgraded its used oil recycling collection facility. The new infrastructure that has been installed will provide the residents of Chetwynd, and in the surrounding areas, with an easy, free and eco-friendly way to recycle their used oil and antifreeze materials.



The Return Collection Facility (RCF) infrastructure grant that the Chetwynd Recycling & Bottle Depot received from BCUOMA provided them with a 20-foot modified sea container with a 2,200-litre tank to replace the outdated collection infrastructure. This new RCF will facilitate the responsible collection and management of used oil, antifreeze, filters and containers.

"Sally Paquette, the owner of Chetwynd Recycling & Bottle depot, is passionate about ensuring that her customers have a user-friendly and environmentally safe used oil recycling facility to return their used oil and antifreeze materials," said David Lawes, CEO, BC Used Oil Management Association. "She reached out to BCUOMA and applied for a RCF infrastructure grant to upgrade her depot with a new sea can, a large 2,200-litre tank, and updated informational signage explaining how to properly recycling used oil and antifreeze. The residents of Chetwynd now have a new, free and easy-to-use recycling infrastructure to recycle their used materials."

The RCF infrastructure grant program requires the responsible environmental handling, collection, transportation, storage, processing and recycling of used oil and antifreeze material using economic, efficient and environmentally acceptable options.

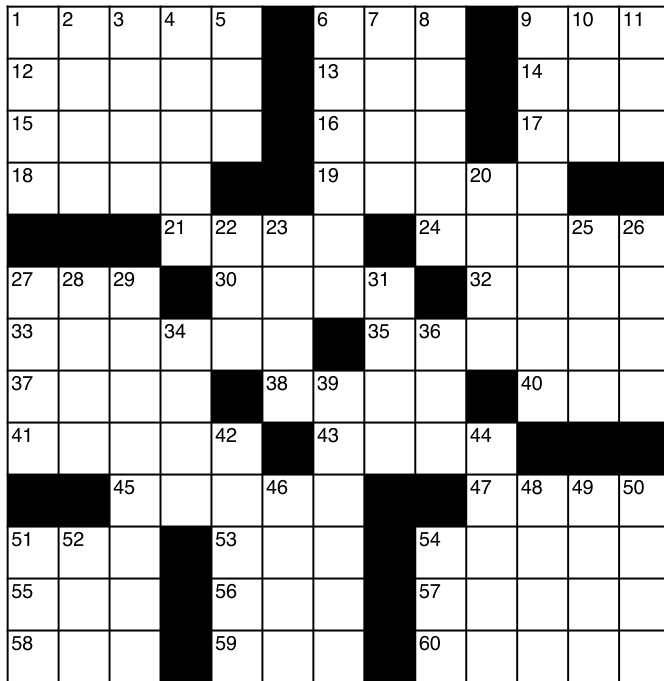

LATEST FUNDING TO BENEFIT BEE HEALTH IN B.C.

There is a buzz in the air as a new round of Bee BC funding opens soon to support more community projects aimed at protecting the health and habitat of bees.

"Bees play a role in the everyday life of British Columbians and a vital role in our agricultural industry," said Lana Popham, Minister of Agriculture, Food and Fisheries. "Farmers rely on bees to pollinate their crops and consumers rely on farmers to put fresh produce on their plates, so the work B.C. beekeepers do to keep our bee populations healthy is important to all citizens. By supporting these projects, we are helping future generations of bees and ensuring food security in B.C."

Beekeepers, beekeeping associations and regional and community-based organizations can apply for funding starting Monday, Jan. 11, 2021. Each project is eligible to receive up to \$5,000 to fund projects enhancing bee health throughout the province.

Projects can range from providing education in communities to planting bee-specific forage to using innovation and technology to help protect and ensure bee health in B.C. The last round of projects included:

- Educational programs for schools in the Kootenays and surrounding areas to teach the life cycle of the honeybee, the importance of pollination and the importance of bees and other pollinators on the larger ecosystem;
- Testing the effectiveness of a seaweed extract supplement to help increase hive size and reduce disease levels among blueberry pollinator bees on the south coast; and
- Mass planting nectar trees and other perennial bee flowers to help increase local nectar forage during the summer on the Gulf Islands.

A new bee-health website has also been launched as an online resource, featuring best practices and lessons learned from completed projects under the Bee BC program: <http://bcbeehealth.ca/>

The Bee BC program provides funding to smaller-scale, community-based projects that support the health of bees in the province. Funding provides support to research, explore, field test and share information about best management practices associated with bee health. The program is administered by the Investment Agriculture Foundation on behalf of the Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Fisheries.

UPGRADED USED OIL RECYCLING FACILITY OPENS IN CHETWYND

BCUOMA continues to look for opportunities to upgrade and improve recycling facility locations across the province in order to provide British Columbians with reasonable access to convenient and free used oil recycling centres. BCUOMA has created signage for BC used oil recycling centres that explains how easy it is to recycle materials properly. Municipalities, private businesses, nonprofit organizations, and other sectors interested in BCUOMA's RCF new infrastructure grants can find out more information at <https://bcusedoil.com/infrastructure-grants/>.

Used oil is a valuable resource and if it is recycled at one of BCUOMA's dedicated RCFs, it can be recovered and re-used. Used oil can be re-refined into new lubricating oil and used as a fuel in pulp mills, cement plants and asphalt plants. Any vehicle maintenance facilities, automobile owners, and other machinery maintenance operations that use oil also can use re-refined oil. Additionally, used oil filters contain reusable scrap metal, which steel producers can reuse for metal products like rebar, nails and wire. Used antifreeze can be reprocessed to produce new automotive antifreeze. Plastic oil and antifreeze containers can be recycled into new oil containers, flowerpots, pipe, guardrails, and patio furniture.

Each year, approximately 50 million litres of oil, and 3 million litres of antifreeze are collected and responsibly managed through the approximately 300 public collection facilities and over 4,000 generators across the province, which are managed by the BCUOMA program. In 2019, BCUOMA collected more than 51 million litres of used oil, which was the highest total amount in the program's history.

Winter Parking on District Roads Information Everyone Should Know



The Streets and Traffic Regulation Bylaw # 909, 2009 section 5.13: Obstruction of Motor Vehicles
No vehicle shall be left standing or parked:
(i) in violation of this bylaw;
(ii) in a position that causes it to interfere with firefighting;
(iii) in a position that causes it to interfere with the normal flow of traffic on a highway; or
(iv) in a position that causes it to interfere with the construction, improvement, maintenance, alterations, extension, widening, marking, or repair of or snow removal from a highway.

Winter is almost upon us and with it comes heavy snow falls. The District of Chetwynd is committed to keeping all our roads safe for all citizens and therefore any vehicles parked in a manner that interferes with effective snow removal will be removed without notice.

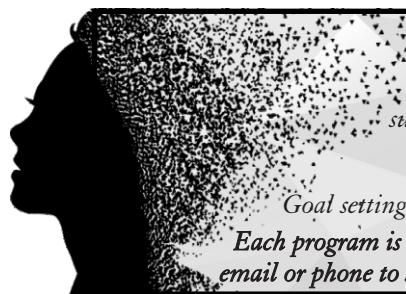
