



Winter Parking on District Roads Information Everyone Should Know



The Streets and Traffic Regulation Bylaw # 909, 2009 section 5.13: Obstruction of Motor Vehicles No vehicle shall be left standing or parked: (I) in violation of this bylaw;

(ii) in a position that causes it to interfere with firefighting;

(iii) in a position that causes to interfere with the normal flow of traffic on a highway; or

(iv) in a position that causes it to interfere with the construction, improvement, maintenance, alterations, extension, widening,

maintenance, alterations, extension, widening, marking, or repair of or snow removal from a highway.

Winter is almost upon us and with it comes heavy snow falls. The District of Chetwynd is committed to keeping all our roads safe for all citizens and therefore any vehicles parked in a manner that interferes with effective snow removal will be removed without notice.

Health For Your Home

Taking Care of Yourself (excerpt from "Your Home in the Country")

When someone says, "Take care of yourself!" what comes to your mind? In truth, what is more important than taking care of yourself? On whose face are you asked to place the oxygen mask in case of an airline emergency? Yes, your own. Why? Because it's a challenge to be of help to anyone if we are out of commission.

When I asked myself what taking care of myself might look like, I found it difficult to come up with an answer. I couldn't seem to swallow the thought of spending time on myself without an aftertaste of guilt on the tongue of my conscience. Mothers and grandmothers tend to give of themselves at the expense of their own needs. If you have a favorite "perk," share your idea with someone who appears too busy to save a little time for themselves.

Here is a guilt-free indulgence I enjoy that might work for you, too! When hard work or weather conditions leave my hands cracked and dry, I wash them with lemon juice (to remove gardening stains), rinse them under clear water, pour a few drops of olive oil and 1/4 teaspoon of coarse salt (to remove grime and soften skin) into my palm. JOINT STATEMENT ON B.C.'S COVID-19 RESPONSE, LATEST UPDATES

Dr. Bonnie Henry, B.C.'s provincial health officer, and Adrian Dix, Minister of Health, have issued the following joint statement regarding updates on the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) response in British Columbia:

"Today, we are reporting 538 new cases of COVID-19, including nine epi-linked cases, for a total of 24,960 cases in British Columbia.

"There are 6,929 active cases of COVID-19 in the province. Currently, 217 individuals are hospitalized with COVID-19, 59 of whom are in intensive care. The remaining people are recovering at home in self-isolation.

"There are 9,977 people under active public health monitoring as a result of identified exposure to known cases and 17,207 people who tested positive have recovered.

"We have had 178 new cases of COVID-19 in the Vancouver Coastal Health region, 309 in the Fraser Health region, 12 in the Island Health region, 28 in the Interior Health region, 11 in the Northern Health region and no new cases of people who reside outside of Canada.

"There has been one new COVID-19 related death, for a total of 321 deaths in British Columbia. We offer our condolences to everyone who has lost their loved ones during the COVID-19 pandemic.

"We have four new health-care facility outbreaks at Cottage-Worthington Pavilion, Langley Memorial Hospital, The Residence at Clayton Heights and Windermere Care Centre.

"There has been one new community outbreak at JGC Fluor BC LNG Joint Venture, a contracted site of the LNG Canada plant and project in Kitimat.

"The change in season is affecting the ways and places we interact with others and this, in turn, is affecting how COVID-19 is spreading in our communities.

"This virus never rests and the trends that started in the Vancouver Coastal and Fraser Health regions are now evident throughout the province.

"While we may feel frustrated or disheartened, we must remember that we flattened our curve before and we can again.

"Our individual actions do make a difference and our public health teams are here to support us in our efforts.

"On Nov. 7, we issued regional orders to slow the rapid transmission we are seeing in social interactions, in certain workplaces and in higher-risk indoor settings, like group fitness activities.

"We are now expanding and amending these provincial health officer orders across the province. As was the case for the previous regional orders, the new provincewide orders focus on three areas: social gatherings, workplaces and group physical activities. Each is outlined in the backgrounder below.

"Our focus is to slow the spread over the next one to two incubation periods and protect those who are most at risk.

"The coming weeks will be the most difficult in our pandemic, but hope is on the horizon. We can protect the ones we love and keep our hospitals, schools and workplaces open if we remain focused on reducing our in-person interactions for now.

"To support the continued safe operation of schools, the provincial health officer has created a rapid response team that will identify and manage exposures and outbreaks in Vancouver Coastal and Fraser Health region schools, and enhance communication with school communities.

"To support comprehensive workplace COVID-19 safety plans, active inspections will be increased across the province. Businesses that do not comply will be subject to fines and/or ordered to close. Environmental health officers will focus on workplaces in the Vancouver Coastal and Fraser Health regions to ensure full compliance and enable rapid response and action.

"As we approach the winter solstice, the darkest day of the year, we should remind each other that it is also the day that we begin to turn back toward the light. By pulling together now we can overcome the challenges before us."

Windows 10 Built in Recovery Options

I've come across a few instances of users that had attempted to change their password, only to find upon rebooting that the new password does not work. However, while attempting their old password, that no longer works either! There are also instances of a Windows update being performed and no longer accepting the user password.

Whatever causes the issue, it is no reason to panic (unless you need to access your files immediately). If you suffer this issue, or fear you may, there are many ways to circumvent it. From the Windows lock screen, you may see a few icons in the bottom right corner of your screen. Among them is the power button as you already

know, but what you may not know is that if you hold down your "shift" key and select "restart" your computer from this power menu, you will access your Advanced Startup features (you will need to continue to hold shift until this screen presents itself).

This advanced startup menu is full of options to fix all sorts of Windows issues. Whatever you do though, do not select to "Reset my PC" or "Factory Recovery" as these options are last resorts and will wipe all saved data on the machine. Your first mode of attack should be opening up Start Up Settings which will give you the option to select a different boot method after rebooting. You will want to try booting in Safe mode to try your new and old password there. If that fails, on to step 2.

Assuming Safe mode boot does not fix your issue, you will want to reenter the Advanced Recovery screen again. Under Advanced Options, you will want to look for the option to Uninstall Updates, from here you have the option to Uninstall latest Feature update, or lastest Quality update. You'll want to try uninstalling the latest Quality update first, and if that doesn't do the trick, try Uninstalling the latest feature update. If these options fail, you can take the PC to your nearest repair shop – we deal with these issues on a daily basis and can easily get you going again!
