HETWYND AIR CADETS ANNUAL CEREMONIA

Chetwynd's 258 Little Giant Squadron of the Royal Canadian Air Cadets had their uniforms looking their finest for their Annual Ceremonial Review, held at Little Prairie Elementary on May 27th. The evening celebrated the end of the year for the program,



culminating with awards recognizing cadets who demonstrated outstanding achievement in a variety of areas. The ceremony began with the cadets marching into the gymnasium in formation, demonstrating several marching patterns before being called to attention. A rendition of "O Canada" in the the original French lyrics followed, after which the cadets received an inspection from Reviewing Officer Tonia Richter.

The cadets then marched past the audience as a group before demonstrating some smaller marching formations and displays, followed by a slideshow detailing the activities the group experienced over the last year and showing what they learned. Two cadets then demonstrated the procedures used by the cadets in shooting competitions, narrated by Sgt. Ford who explained the reasoning behind each stance used by the cadets. 

MATT'S MUSINGS




The thrill of victory...and the agony of defeat. So went the famous intro to ABC's "Wide World of Sports" in the 1970s, and the phrase is poignant for anyone who has ever rooted for a team and watched them fall short, as I did the other night when my favourite team, the Oklahoma City Thunder, lost to the defending NBA Champion Golden State Warriors. Up 3 games to 1, it seemed a foregone conclusion that the Thunder would win and advance to face LeBron James and the Cleveland Cavaliers in the NBA Finals, but as they say, that's why they play the games. The Thunder lost 3 straight games and must watch the Finals on TV like the other 27 NBA teams who fell short this year. And there's still more heartbreak to come. Either Cleveland wins and denies Golden State the storybook ending to their record-breaking regular season of 73 wins and only 9 losses, or Golden State wins, makes history and

the city of Cleveland is dealt another agonizing defeat.

There's not enough space in this column to outline the complete history of misery in Cleveland Sports since the retirement of Jim Brown, but a quick Google search should bring you up to speed. Needless to say, they have experienced as much suffering as almost any other sports city you can name. Every team's fans except one are sad at the end of the season, having worked so hard only to fall short, and yet the fandom persists. What is it about sports that keeps people coming back, year after year, when the vast majority of fans will experience a letdown at some point before the season ends? This is where the "thrill of victory" part is so important. The feeling that comes with watching a team coalesce into a complete unit, go through trials and tribulations and come out victorious in the end. Knowing that you supported them the entire way makes you feel like you're part of it, which is why so many sports fans will talk about their teams using words like "we" and "us" despite having no input or impact on anything their team does (my apologies to your lucky socks/hat/shirt).

Why else would fans in a city like Cleveland continue to hold on and believe that someday, they will be rescued from the pit of despair their sports teams have wallowed in for decades? Perhaps worse than simply always being bad, they've come achingly close to glory so many times only to fall short, with the Browns in the 1980s experiencing collapses so devastating they hardly seem believable, and the Cavaliers twice reaching the Finals with LeBron only to be denied. Will this finally be their moment? Or will the team that seeks to solidify their claim as the greatest in NBA history deny them again, as they did last year? Their previous victory over Cleveland was really a victory over LeBron, as several of Cleveland's star players were out with injury, and LeBron still almost singlehandedly won the series himself. This year he has all his teammates healthy and rested, and while I was crushed by Oklahoma City's collapse, I eagerly anticipate what lies ahead in the Finals. CHETWYND CHAINSAW CARVERS – PROFILES

In advance of the Chetwynd International Chainsaw Carving Competition the Coffee Talk Express will be running profiles of the carvers you'll see in action from June 9-12.

CHAD DANCZYK



Chad Danczyk began carving in 2011 when he attempted to carve a bear out of maple and while unsuccessful, the effort drewhim into the carving world where he quickly began to excel. His carpentry background gave him experience working with wood and by 2013 he was entering his first carving competition, winning first place with the judges, carver's choice and people's choice in addition to winning two out of three of the quick carves.

His success has continued throughout his carving career, winning first place in every competition he's entered

except for one second place finish. He's yet to visit Chetwynd but refers to it as "the Super Bowl of carving competitions" and says he is "honoured to be able to compete with a lot of the guys that I'm inspired by." He credits the support of his wife and two children in helping him keep focussed on the future.

He lives in central Wisconsin and carves in Northern Wisconsin at Custom Landscaping of Eagle River during the summer, where he receives a lot of request for wildlife carvings. He enjoys getting the odd "off-the-wall commission" but his current favourite thing to carve are eagles. He has a few ideas in mind for what he'll make in Chetwynd, but says "time will tell if the log will allow my idea to become a reality." "You never know what the log will throw at you," he continued, "and at times adjustments need to be made." Given the string of success he's had over his brief career it's clear that Danczyk knows how to adjust when difficulties present themselves.

Danczyk believes there are some misconceptions related to the word "chainsaw" when people think about carvings, and that "some people will think crude, rough work when they hear 'chainsaw carving." "Lacking detail, limitations, blocky are words that come to mind that I've heard until they actually see what the possibilities are," all words no Chetwynd resident would ever dream of using to describe the intricate, beautiful carvings that dot the town's landscape. Regarding his learning curve entering the carving world, he noted that while his carpentry background gave him knowledge of "tools, crafting benching and joinery," he struggled to reprogram himself, as "in carpentry everything is square, equal, level and plum, so when I started carving I followed the same 'rules." To get beyond this, one valuable lesson he had to learn was that "in nature there are no straight lines."

He is very excited for his first visit to Chetwynd to compete against people who are "at the top of the mountain" in the carving world, and given his history don't be surprised if his name is called when the winners are announced.

Recently he began combining his passion for chainsaw carving with his interest in airbrushing, creating works with added color that continue to showcase the elegance of the wood's natural grain.

He began his career as a professional carver in 2010, first becoming interested when his brother asked him to recreate a life-size sculpture of the Roman



god Mars for a local tourist attraction. At the time, he wasn't even aware that chainsaw carving existed but since the provided log was very large, he used a chainsaw (Stihl MS 260 with a regular 18" bar) as his "weapon of choice" to remove the unneeded wood as quickly as possible. He was very pleased with the finished sculpture and since it paid well, "I thought that might be something I should try making my money with because I had so much fun creating something." The enormous amount of positive feedback he received helped convince him that this was a perfect career path for him to take.

He says he doesn't have a favourite thing to carve but he puts "all of my heart into each single creation of mine, no matter how big, small, well-paid or donated." He does enjoy carving wildlife however as it "always challenges me to get as close to the real deal as possible."

J.J. first visited Chetwynd in 2010 and had only a rough idea of what he would carve, and quickly became enamoured with the town and the event, which he calls "by far the best carving gig for a chainsaw carver to join!" In his first year he had a plan but "not enough experience and tools to really be able to compete with the world-class creations of all the other guys," but says he is thoroughly prepared for this year. "I have a plan, and a plan B," he noted, and promises his creation will be unique and "will be something [that has] never been seen before!"

He recalls sharing thoughts with his future wife about the first time they were invited, and how "everyone involved gave us the feeling as if we really belong there," which left him smiling for a long time after the competition ended. The feeling he got from Chetwynd "really made me push myself to get better in what I do really fast, to hopefully get invited back to this world class event!" J.J. says that this year he feels honoured "to be able to carve my fifth main piece for the city of Chetwynd" regardless of whether or not he places in the competition. He recently made a decision that his future is not in competing, but will always accept an invitation to Chetwynd to "take the time to join this amazing group of people for those few short days and bring them a truly one of a kind piece of my life."

This is a story about real people who live in a real town in real time in real houses. They have real issues with which they have to deal on real days whether the weather is sunny or overcast, sleeting or balmy. They are like you and me. In fact, they are you and me. This is our town.

Their kids have real runny noses and some of them are colicky – really; their clothes wear out before they outgrow them. The washing machine starts to make strange noises and the refrigerator is leaking. The brakes on the five-year-old car have to be replaced just when you were intending to pay off the debt on the 50-inch television. Sound like life? It is life under the stern rule of the Second Law of Thermodynamics who seems to be in charge in these parts as in all parts of this unruly globe.

The rule of the Second Law shows no favoritism. The rich as well as the poor, and all between, are subject to his unrelenting, wearing pressure. Everything we possess, including our beautiful bodies, will ultimately have to yield to his rule.

When we factor into the equation all the elements of our experiences and then add to that the taxes assessed by the various authorities under which we live, we have to make concerted efforts to keep looking on the sunny side.

Some very real people (eight in number) posted some thoughts on the 2% increase to property taxes recently voted by Council. I clearly grasped the real message they were sending.

But please bear with me. I will try to put some numbers in perspective. Not that perspective will make you feel any better about paying taxes but it might help you understand the actions of Mayor and Council. Mayor and Council were elected to set policy for this community. In a real world clear policy is really essential to order and resistance to the persistent Second Law as it applies to municipal infrastructure.

So consider the numbers and bear in mind that these are numbers for real properties, some of which belong to the individuals who posted their thoughts. In every tax notice there are two factors determining the size of the payment: assessment value of the property and tax rate. While Council cannot influence the assessment, the tax rate is completely within Council's purview.

I have looked at the numbers for six properties that are typical (though they may not reflect your experience). The 2% tax increase to five of these properties averaged \$16.37 when applied to an average increase in assessment of 8% for the same properties. The sixth property experienced a 2% decrease in assessment with a corresponding decrease in tax payable. When all factors for these six properties are thrown into the mix (which includes taxation by the School District, the Regional

District, Northern Health, and Policing) your property taxes may increase or decrease depending on what the other jurisdictions do.
