CHETWYND COUNCILLORS SPLIT OVER **CANFOR TAX EXEMPTION**

On Monday October 5th, 2015, the District of Chetwynd held a Regular Council Meeting at the Cottonwood Hall with all Councillors and the Mayor present.


A delegation of Ana Peasgood and Val Jensen from the Chetwynd Public Library did a presentation on the Third Annual Young at Heart Seniors Christmas Dinner. The representatives from the Chetwynd Public Library asked for a \$2000 dollar grant to help with costs of running the event, which is planned for December 16th. Council moved to forward the request to administration for consideration.

A major discussion between Councillors ensued regarding a Tax Exemption for Canadian Forest Products related to the construction of their new pellet plant located beside their present lumber and planer mills. The estimated cost of this plant is 5.3 million dollars, and is set to be complete by October 31st. Canfor applied for the full tax exemption on the pellet plant, and councillors Mel Deck and Ernest Pfanner voted against the motion to grant the tax exemption.

Another report was regarding a shipping container at the Maisey residence on the South Access Road, which is in violation of a zoning bylaw. Council voted to place a charge against the title of the property. The owners, when contacted by administrations, said they had no objections. This means the property will now be listed as having a zoning bylaw infraction if and when the Maiseys decide to put the residence on the market.

Council also announced that long-time District employee Linda Kearns has been named as the District's new Manager of Financial Services.

The next Council Meeting is set to take place Monday October 19th and the location will be announced on Peace FM.







GETTING INKED? MAKE SURE IT IS FROM AN APPROVED TATTOO SERVICE

The design and placement of a tattoo are important considerations, but so is the tattoo shop. Safe and clean tattoo service providers are held to a high standard to help prevent the transmission of bloodborne diseases including HIV, Hepatitis B, and Hepatitis C.

In order to make sure you are safe, it is recommend you:

· Avoid soliciting the services of untrained tattoo artists. Tattoo artists are not a regulated profession in B.C. It is the responsibility of the individual artist to ensure that they have learned proper and safe tattooing procedures. A responsible tattoo artist should be able to address any health concerns or questions that you may have.



- · Avoid tattoo studios that do not have health approval. Tattoo studios must undergo a health approval and inspection process to ensure that proper precautions and equipment are in place to protect public health. If you are unsure, ask to see their health approval permit.
- · Refer to the attached checklist on the Northern Health environmental health page for things to consider when choosing a tattoo artist or studio. If something does not seem right, you can report the concerns to Northern Health.

In addition to the risks for blood borne diseases, people can also get bacterial skin infections, allergic reactions, scar tissue, or small knots or bumps if the appropriate precautions are not taken. If you suspect you are experiencing any of these health risks, make sure to contact your physician.

These health risks are associated with improperly sterilized equipment, contaminated or toxic inks/pigments, unclean studios, and/or unsafe procedures. Boiling instruments and chlorine bleach solution are not acceptable methods of sterilization.

If you have any questions, concerns, or require more information, please contact your local <u>environmental health officer</u>. Information on current complaints against tattoo artists can be found on Northern Health's website health alerts section.

I've written of our magnificent Chainsaw carving event that is known around the province. That event should not be allowed to die.


Now that I've started remembering there seems to be so much going on in our town. Let's keep up our spirits and soldier through the rough spots that are bound to come.






