PROVINCE LAUNCHES BC BUS NORTH FOR AFFORDABLE, SAFE TRAVEL IN NORTHERN B.C.

The B.C. government is launching a new, interim long-haul northern bus service to fill the gap Greyhound will leave behind, and help make sure British Columbians living in the north are able to travel safely and affordably from community to community, Premier John Horgan announced.

The new service, called BC Bus North, will begin providing service on June 4, 2018, just days after Greyhound discontinues the majority of its northern bus routes on June 1.

"People in the North rely on transportation for their livelihoods, to access the health and education services they need, and to visit family and friends," said Premier Horgan. "In the face of Greyhound's decision, our job is to make sure northern communities and the people who live there are able to stay connected through safe, reliable and affordable public transportation."

BC Bus North's service will include two round-trips per week, between Prince Rupert and Prince George, Prince George and Valemount, and Prince George to Dawson Creek/Fort St. John. Additionally, BC Bus North will offer one round-trip per week from Fort Nelson to Dawson Creek/Fort St. John.

"BC Bus North will help make sure that people in the North, especially those in rural and remote communities, don't feel stranded and isolated,"said Claire Trevena, Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure. "Once the service is up and running, we're going to take the next step by working with northern communities to find a long-term solution that delivers a sustainable, affordable solution for these communities."

The service will be affordable with one-way fares being either \$35 or \$45, per route, depending on how far people are travelling.

Northern B.C. has unique transportation challenges due to its remote geography and vast distances between communities. Greyhound's move to eliminate service in the North has put people at risk for isolation, such as those without access to personal vehicles, and especially people of low income, Indigenous communities, women, seniors and people with disabilities.

The minister directed BC Transit to work with one of its service operators to provide a base-level service to help fill the gap left by Greyhound. BC Bus North will be operated by Pacific Western Transportation using four highway coaches, equipped with luggage and washroom facilities.

"We're looking forward to delivering a long-haul service for the first time to connect people and communities in northern B.C.," said Erinn Pinkerton, interim president and CEO BC Transit. "Our team has been working hard to find ways to make this interim solution meet the needs of customers in the North."

The Province will fund BC Bus North for 12 months, during which time government will work with local leaders to evaluate the demand for this new service, and develop a long-term transportation solution that

works for people in this part of the province.

PROVINCE CELEBRATES DAY OF THE HONEY BEE WITH SUPPORT FOR BEE HEALTH RESEARCH

The front lawns of the Parliament Buildings were a-buzz today, as honey bees and other native pollinators were feted for their critical role in B.C.'s sustainable food system.

May 29, 2018, was Day of the Honey Bee. It celebrates bees as crop pollinators and honey producers, and raises awareness around the current plight of bee health within the province, and globally.

Lana Popham, Minister of Agriculture, was joined by representatives of the BC Honey Producers Association, the Capital Region Beekeepers Association, Feed the Bees, and members from 4-H British Columbia. Popham announced BeeBC, a \$100,000 funding program that supports community-based research on bee health.

"We gather together to celebrate these amazing creatures that do so much for our quality of life here in B.C., whether they're pollinating crops for our agricultural sector or providing B.C. honey to British Columbians," said Popham. "Our government is taking the added step of supporting a growing, thriving B.C. bee community, by funding the BeeBC community research program, to help address concerns around bee health, and develop a larger provincial population of honey bees and native pollinators."

The BeeBC program will provide funding to smaller-scale community-based projects that support the health of B.C.'s bees. Delivered by the Investment Agriculture Foundation, the fund will provide up to \$100,000 over two years to support small-scale regional or community-based projects to research, explore, field-test and share information about best management practices associated with bee health.

"The beekeeping industry of B.C. appreciates the growth in interest in bees and small-scale beekeeping throughout British Columbia. We express our appreciation to Minister Lana Popham for recognizing the Day of the Honey Bee, and for the support of the Ministry of Agriculture in enabling the BC Honey Producers Association to continue to support and improve the beekeeping industry," said Kerry Clark, president of the BC Honey Producers Association. "Bees are still having a hard time, and with our partners, this funding will be put to good use in projects to research, field-test and share information about best management practices associated with bee health. We will work to support community beekeeping, to meet the needs of so many crops for pollination, and to supply the growing demand for authentic local honey."

The government has increased support for the honey bee industry since summer 2017. Late last year, the Province signed on as a cosponsor of a study to find solutions to the bee health problems of honeybee colonies involved in pollination, with a contribution of \$25,000 to support that research. Last week, two new inspectors were added to the provincial apiculture team. The new inspectors were appointed to the northwest region of the province, covering the McBride-Prince George-Vanderhoof and Telkwa-Smithers-Terrace regions.

Honey bees play an important part of B.C.'s agriculture sector as pollinators of crops, contributing an estimated \$538 million to the economy in the province. Across Canada, they have an economic contribution estimated at over \$3.2 billion.

ONLY YOU CAN PREVENT WILDFIRES

Smokey the Bear is constantly reminding us with billboards and signs throughout the province to prevent wildfires, but the reminder sometimes isn't enough as the threat of wildfires year after year seems to get worse. There are already several wildfires burning throughout the province and its only the beginning of the hottest season. The worst part is most of them were caused by human negligence.

These last few days of wet weather is a great thing to see. As our area's fire rating climbed throughout the past weeks, and the wind and hot weather made everything become tinder dry, the threat was real. This week we can breathe a sigh of relief as the threat of wildfires in our area has lowered a tiny bit. This does not mean we're out of the woods, any small spark from an atv, ember from a burning cigarette or flash of lightning could change that.

This summer, meteorologists predict a dry hot summer throughout the province, which won't do our forests any favours. The best way to prevent wildfires is to avoid all burning in windy weather, never discard lit cigarettes, or matches. Clear an area around your campfire of all debris in reach of the flames, you could even add a circle of rocks around the perimeter as an extra precaution. While the fire is burning, make sure there is always someone attending it. When putting the campfire out, stir the ashes around after dumping a large amount of water on the fire until the ashes are cool and moist. And always plan ahead for the slight chance of an impromptu evacuation.

Our area just so happens to be filled with deciduous trees which don't burn as easily as pine trees which are coniferous. Our overall wildfire rating in the South Peace region area is significantly lower than say, the Okanagan area, because of this. As we all know from the fires extremely close to home the last few years, this doesn't exclude our area of wildfires, simply lowers the risk by a small fraction.

In some cases fire is good for a forest, but unplanned fires that burn too hot can make it hard for the forest to recover. Trees in some forests can be over 4,000 years old. A forest can recover from a fire but unfortunately, it can take an average forest about 70–100 years to be what it was before the fire happened.

ICBC BENEFITS DOUBLE TO BETTER SUPPORT CRASH VICTIMS

People injured in a traffic crash on or after Jan. 1, 2018, are now eligible for up to \$300,000 from ICBC toward their medical care and recovery, up from a previous maximum of \$150,000.

This improvement will help the 35 British Columbians on average each year who are catastrophically injured in crashes, and face lifetime care expenses that would have exceeded the previous limit. In addition to wage loss and medical appointments, accident benefits can cover extraordinary supports, such as home care, wheelchairs and vehicle upgrades for accessibility.

"This is the first major improvement to ICBC's accident benefits in more than 25 years, made possible by reining in out-of-control legal and other costs, which will also put ICBC on the road to fiscal sustainability," said Attorney General David Eby. "We're shifting the focus to a care-focused insurance system — one that makes taking care of people injured in a crash the top priority, with more money for the treatments and support they need to get better, and firm control on legal and autobody repair costs."

"The doubling of benefits to \$300,000 means those facing severe injuries will be able to live with dignity," said Lorraine Tran, who was catastrophically injured in a collision with a moose. "When I was injured, I knew the \$150,000 wasn't going to last. A wheelchair, a suitable van and a bed are just basic, initial ecessities."

"Disability Alliance BC (DABC) has been advocating for improvements to accident benefits for 12 years," said Jane Dyson, DABC executive director. "The doubling of the overall allowance for medical care and recovery is a significant improvement, and we welcome these long overdue changes, which will mean that people who are catastrophically injured in motor vehicle accidents have better supports available to help them rebuild their lives. We are very happy to know that the regulations governing this important change have been completed." Additional improvements are planned for April 1, 2019.

Quick Facts:

The previous limit of \$150,000 for medical care and recovery expenses was set in 1991.

Accident benefits are available to anyone injured in a crash, regardless of who is at fault.

Effective April 1, 2019, when cost-saving reforms around the resolutions of minor injury claims come into force, additional improvements to ICBC accident benefits will include:

Wage loss payments for customers injured and unable to work will increase to \$740 per week from \$300 — up 147%.

Benefits to help with household tasks like cooking, cleaning and grocery shopping will increase to \$280 per week from \$145 — up 93%. The funeral cost benefit will increase 200%, to \$7,500 from \$2,500.

Death benefits, which include payments to surviving family members, will rise to \$30,000 from \$18,000.

These changes, along with a limit on payouts for pain and suffering for minor injuries and use of the Civil Resolution Tribunal, will enable not just these benefit improvements, but are also expected to reduce ICBC's claim costs by more than \$1 billion per year. These changes help address the massive growth in injury costs in B.C., which rose by 80% between 2009 and 2016, to \$2.7 billion from \$1.5 billion.
