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CHETWYND ROTARY TO CONSTRUCT OLYMPIC-QUALITY RUNNING TRACK



Julia Nelson and Dale Phillips, members of the Rotary Club of Chetwynd, are heading up a project to build a running track at the Rotary Park (soccer fields). Julia says the track will cost approximately \$500,000 and will be paid for by grants and local corporate and personal donations.

"The finished project will be a 400 metre Olympic quality running track

with a 2 inch rubberized surface and 8 lanes. This track will be available to be utilized year-round by community groups and individuals. The track will benefit our community members who wish to exercise on a surface that is easy on the joints! The track will also be beneficial to the schools and community group who wish to train and host competitions on a regional level. This track will make Chetwynd a track and field competition destination and therefore provide economic benefits to our community as well," Julia says, also adding that it will accessible to anyone and everyone.

If the money required to start the project is received on time, construction should start this summer and be completed by early fall. The District of Chetwynd has agreed to maintain the track via lawn maintenance and snow removal.

When asked whose idea the track was, Julia said, "I brought my dream of an Olympic quality running track to the Rotary club, but truly this is the dream of all parents who have had children in Soccer, and who have spent time at the current Soccer Fields and Rotary Park. The track will provide an exercise opportunity to those parents who are spending time at the Soccer fields. The track will provide a training opportunity for children who are gifted runners and want to compete on a quality track. The track will be the training centre for many generations of athletes to come."

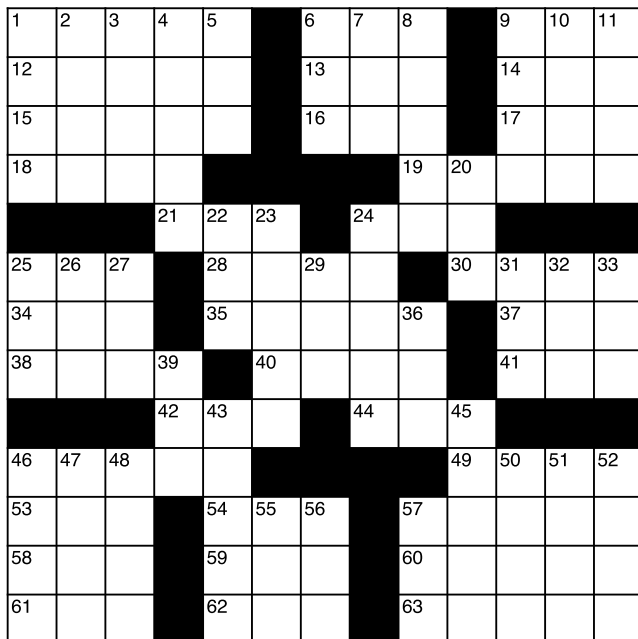

2021 CAMPING SEASON RESERVATIONS OPENING FOR B.C. RESIDENTS

The official start of the 2021 camping season is still a few months away, but people living in B.C. can soon begin reserving campsites in provincial parks to help plan trips close to home.

The Discover Camping reservation service opens March 8, 2021, giving B.C. residents an opportunity to book a campsite two months in advance of their arrival date. People who live in the province will have priority access to campsite reservations throughout the summer.

“Our provincial parks have never been as important as they are right now. They provide a special place to safely connect with nature and improve our health and well-being during these difficult times,” said George Heyman, Minister of Environment and Climate Change Strategy. “We are all looking forward to another summer of camping and outdoor recreation in B.C., and while public health concerns and advice remain, we are asking people to pick a campground as close to home as possible to avoid long road trips and non-essential travel.”

Reservations can be made no further than two months out from arrival. Since COVID-19 is still impacting the province and travel opportunities are limited, this year’s camping season is expected to be busy. BC Parks appreciates that a positive camping experience starts the moment a site is booked, so it is important to be prepared with back up options for preferred sites and dates.

On July 8, people living in other provinces can reserve campsites for the remainder of the season. Reservations can be made at: <https://www.discovercamping.ca>

“We recognize the heightened importance of outdoor recreation during these uncertain times,” said Kelly Greene, Parliamentary Secretary for Environment. “Our government is committed to ensuring British Columbians can safely enjoy the natural beauty of our province close to home.”

Opening provincial campgrounds safely to support public health guidelines means it will not be business as usual in many campgrounds. Changes are being made to ensure everyone has a safe visit, such as how many people can be in a campsite and restrictions on group sites. Reservations for day-use facilities, including picnic shelters and halls, remain closed for the 2021 season.

Everything there is to know about reservations and facilities, including up-to-date information on the status of favourite provincial parks, is available at: bcparks.ca

Public health guidelines for gatherings may change throughout the season and between the time of booking a campsite and a scheduled arrival date. All camping parties must ensure they meet current public health guidelines for gatherings, even if those allowed numbers are less than the maximum site allowance.

“We are looking forward to another great season of taking care of our spectacular provincial parks and welcoming you into our campgrounds. We are doing everything we can to ensure our parks are safe for visitors,” said Eddie Wood, president, Society of Park Operators. “Many of our campgrounds will be very busy, so it’s important to plan ahead, follow public health guidelines, and enjoy B.C.’s outdoors. It’s going to be a fantastic season.”

Prior to the general opening on March 8, backcountry camping reservations will open on March 1 for the full season for two popular backcountry trips – the Berg Lake Trail in Mount Robson Provincial Park and the canoe circuit in Bowron Lake Provincial Park. The Berg Lake Trail can be reserved from June 12 to Sept. 30, and the Bowron Lake Canoe Circuit can be reserved from May 15 to Sept. 23.

Make Your Own Invisible Ink With Your Kids!

Making invisible ink to write and reveal secret messages is a great science project to try, even if you think you don't have the right chemicals. Why? Because just about any chemical can be used as invisible ink if you know how to use it.

What Is Invisible Ink?

Invisible ink is any substance that you can use to write a message that is invisible until the ink is revealed. You write your message with the ink using a cotton swab, dampened finger, fountain pen, or toothpick. Let the message dry. You might also want to write a normal message on the paper so that it doesn't appear to be blank and meaningless. If you write a cover message, use a ballpoint pen, pencil, or crayon, since fountain pen ink could run into your invisible ink. Avoid using lined paper to write your invisible message for the same reason.

How you reveal the message depends on the ink you use. Most invisible inks are made visible by heating the paper. Ironing the paper and holding it over a 100-watt bulb are easy ways to reveal these types of messages. Some messages are developed by spraying or wiping the paper with a second chemical. Other messages are revealed by shining an ultraviolet light on the paper.

Ways to Make Invisible Ink

Anyone can write an invisible message, assuming you have paper, because bodily fluids can be used as invisible ink. If you don't feel like collecting urine, here are some alternatives:

Heat-Activated Invisible Inks

You can reveal the message by ironing the paper, setting it on a radiator, placing it in an oven (set to lower than 450 degrees F), or holding it up to a hot light bulb.

To write the message you can use:

- Any acidic fruit juice (e.g., lemon, apple, or orange juice)
- Onion juice - Baking soda (sodium bicarbonate) - Vinegar
- White wine - Diluted cola - Diluted honey - Milk - Soapy water
- Sucrose (table sugar) solution - Urine

Inks Developed by Chemical Reactions

These inks are sneakier because you have to know how to reveal them. Most of them work using pH indicators, so when in doubt, paint or spray a suspected message with a base (such as sodium carbonate solution) or an acid (such as lemon juice). Some of these inks will reveal their message when heated (e.g., vinegar).

Examples of such inks include:

- Thymolphthalein, developed by ammonia fumes or sodium carbonate (or another base)
- Vinegar or diluted acetic acid, developed by red cabbage water
- Sodium bicarbonate (baking soda), developed by grape juice
- Sodium chloride (table salt), developed by silver nitrate
- Lead(II) nitrate, developed by sodium iodide
- Cobalt chloride, developed by potassium ferricyanide
- Starch (e.g., corn starch or potato starch), developed by iodine solution
- Lemon juice, developed by iodine solution
