The Supreme Court of Canada Shuts Down BC's Attempt to Regulate Trans Mountain Pipeline

The Supreme Court of Canada has shut down B.C.'s provincial government's move to regulate what can flow through a Trans Mountain pipeline expansion from Edmonton.

The B.C. government wanted to require provincial permits before heavy oil could be shipped through pipelines in the province. Two years ago, In 2018, it asked the B.C. Court of Appeal if such permits were possible and last May the question was answered when the court of appeal said no! Ruling in B.C.'s favour would violate Ottawa's authority under the Constitution to approve and regulate any pipeline that crosses a provincial border.

This decision removes one of the remaining obstacles for the Trans Mountain pipeline expansion, which seeks to twin an existing pipeline running between Edmonton and Burnaby, B.C. The twinned pipeline, with roughly twice the capacity of the original, would carry only diluted bitumen, a heavy crude produced in Alberta's oilsands. The existing pipeline will continue to ship mostly refined petroleum products such as gasoline, and light crude.



B.C.'s New Democrat government was elected in 2017 partly on a promise to oppose the expansion but the province had limited options because of the Constitution. B.C. Premier John Horgan expressed the province's disappointment in a statement. On the other side of the border, Alberta Premier Jason Kenney took immediately to Twitter to express gratitude for the court decision.

Foods with Positive Health Benefits Have Lower Environmental Impacts

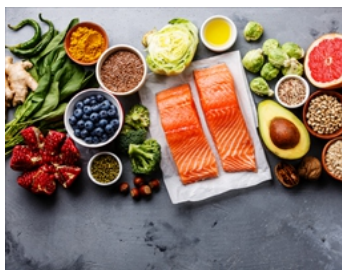
It turns out that eating healthy is not only good for you, but it can also lessen your impact on the environment. According to a recent study published in the Proceedings of Natural Academy of Sciences journal, certain foods commonly associated with improved health also contribute to a more sustainable global food system.

The seven foods identified include fruits, vegetables, whole-grain cereals, olive oil, legumes, nuts and fish. The study also shows that consuming one additional serving per day of any of these seven foods was linked to a lower risk of type 2 diabetes, stroke, coronary heart disease and colorectal cancer.

At the other end of the spectrum, researchers found that red meat and processed meat were consistently linked to the largest increase in disease risk while also having the most negative environmental impacts.

These findings are supported by another study published in the same journal that looked at the correlation of climate change and healthy eating. For example, the emissions associated with producing one kilogram of beef are almost eight times higher than those associated with producing the same amount of fish.

Fortunately, what we choose to put on our plates really does make a meaningful difference. Although it may feel small, the daily act of deciding what we eat can have a large ripple effect on the planet. Look for global, science-based certifications like the MSC blue fish label that certifies wild, sustainable and traceable seafood or the ASC label that indicates responsibly farmed seafood. There's also the Certified Organic label that recognizes production systems that sustain the health of soils and ecosystems.



As the need for climate action intensifies, meeting The UN Sustainable Development Goals and The Paris Agreement targets has never been more vital to our overall wellbeing, the future of our food systems, and the health of the planet. By choosing healthier and more sustainable options, it's not only a clear win for our bodies, but it also contributes to reducing our carbon footprint and brings us closer to achieving global goals.

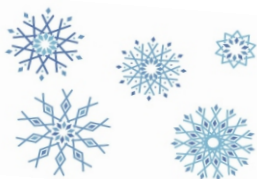

Safety tips for snowmobile season

January 18 to 26 is International Snowmobile Safety Week, and the theme is *Safe Riders! You make snowmobiling safe.* Here's a rundown of some of the most important safety practices to follow when operating a snowmobile.

PRECAUTIONS TO TAKE BEFORE LEAVING

Plan your trip in advance and practise staying safe by adhering to the following:

- Choose trails that you know well or that you've researched in advance.
- Bring a map of the area.
- Make sure your snowmobile is tuned up.
- If it's your first time using a snowmobile, don't take it out until you've familiarized yourself with how to use it. Be sure to take it slow during your first ride.
- Avoid snowmobiling alone and give someone who won't be in your company an itinerary that includes your route and the duration of your ride.
- Ensure that you've memorized the hand signals used to communicate between snowmobilers.

STAYING SAFE ON THE TRAIL

Snowmobiles are definitely powerful, which is part of what makes them fun. However, they can also be dangerous should you fail to take the needed precautions. Here's what you should do:

- Know your limits and the limits of your snowmobile.
- Respect signage and be attentive to your surroundings.
- Stop completely at intersections and look both ways before proceeding.
- Stay on the trail and respect private property.
- Be extra careful when driving at night. Adjust your speed so that you don't "over-drive" your headlights.

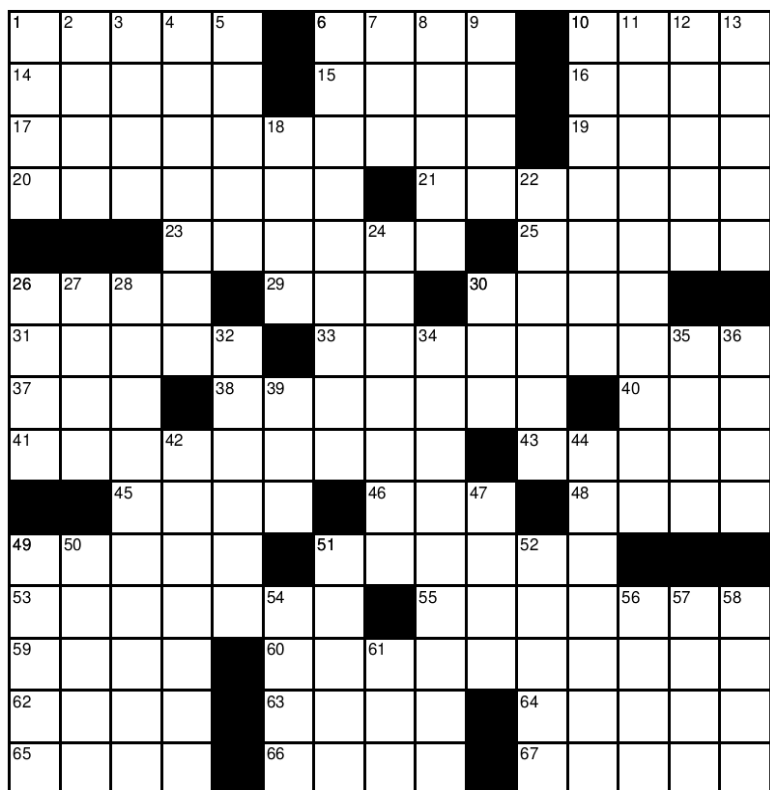
