STATEMENT FROM MP ZIMMER REGARDING HIS VOTE ON THE SECOND READING OF BILL C-6

OTTAWA – Bob Zimmer, Member of Parliament for Prince George-Peace River-Northern Rockies, issued the following statement regarding his decision to vote against Bill C-6 in its current form:

“Make no mistake, I am opposed to the practice of conversion therapy.

“However, I am concerned that the current wording of Bill C-6 leaves open the possibility that voluntary conversations between individuals and their parents, family members, pastors, teachers, or their counsellors may be criminalized.

“Freedom of speech, freedom of religion and freedom of association are fundamental in our Charter of Rights and Freedoms and I believe the current language of this legislation is an encroachment on those foundational principles.

“I will be watching to see if this language is changed when the Standing Committee on Justice and Human Rights reviews the legislation before it comes back to the House of Commons for a third and final vote.”

STATE OF EMERGENCY EXTENDED TO CONTINUE B.C.'S COVID-19 RESPONSE

The Province of British Columbia has formally extended the provincial state of emergency, allowing health and emergency management officials to continue to use extraordinary powers under the Emergency Program Act to support the Province's COVID-19 pandemic response.

The state of emergency is extended through the end of the day on Nov. 10, 2020, to allow staff to continue to take the necessary actions to keep

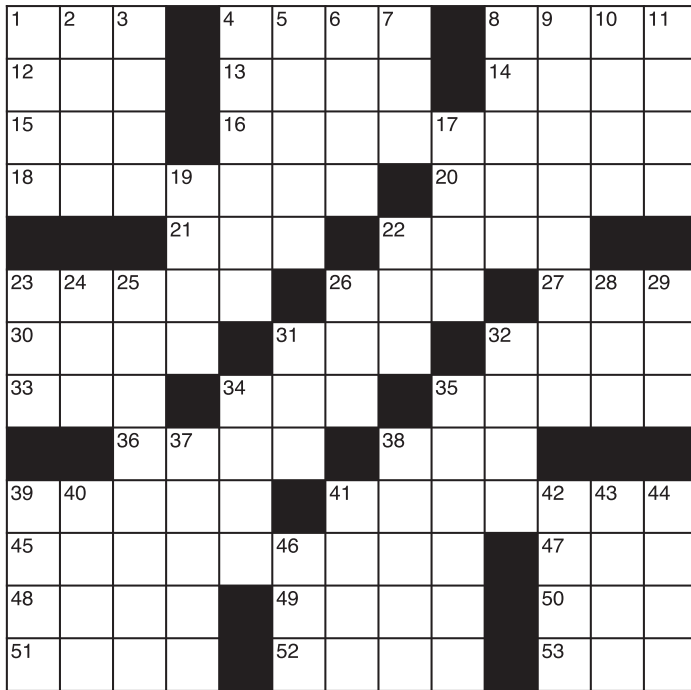

Once your little monsters are in bed, wrap up the evening in your pajamas with a bowl of popcorn and a scary movie.

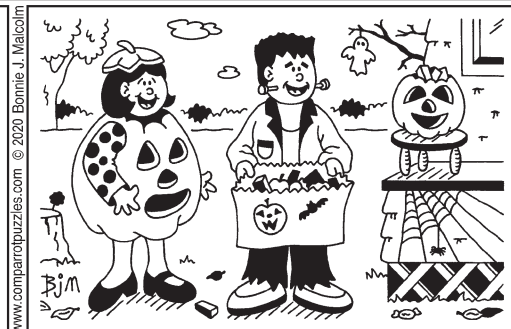

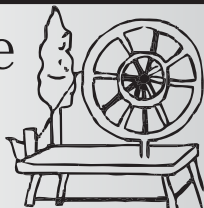
her daughter, as a ballerina; her younger son, as the cabin boy in Treasure Island.

BEWITCHED CUPCAKES



INGREDIENTS

- 3/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 3/4 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2 eggs, room temperature
- 1/2 cup white sugar
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- 3 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1/2 cup buttermilk, room temperature
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter, room temp
- 225 grams cream cheese
- 4 cups icing sugar
- 1 teaspoon orange gel food colouring

Directions

1. Preheat the oven to 177 C (350 F). Place cupcake liners in each cup of a 12-cup muffin tin.
2. In a large bowl, mix the flour, cocoa powder, baking powder, baking soda and 1/4 teaspoon of salt. Set aside. In a second bowl, mix the eggs, sugar, brown sugar, oil and 2 teaspoons of vanilla extract.
3. Incorporate half of the wet ingredients with the dry ingredients, and mix well. Add half of the buttermilk and mix well. Add the rest of the wet ingredients and buttermilk, and mix well.
4. Pour the mixture into each muffin tin cup to fill them halfway. Bake for 20 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the middle of a cupcake comes out clean.
5. In the meantime, use a beater to mix the butter and cream cheese until smooth. Add the rest of the salt and vanilla, and mix well. Use the beater at a low speed to slowly incorporate the icing sugar until the mixture is smooth. Add the food colouring and mix until the icing is a uniform orange.
6. Let the cupcakes cool completely, then use a piping bag to ice them. Decorate with candies or small Halloween-themed cookies.

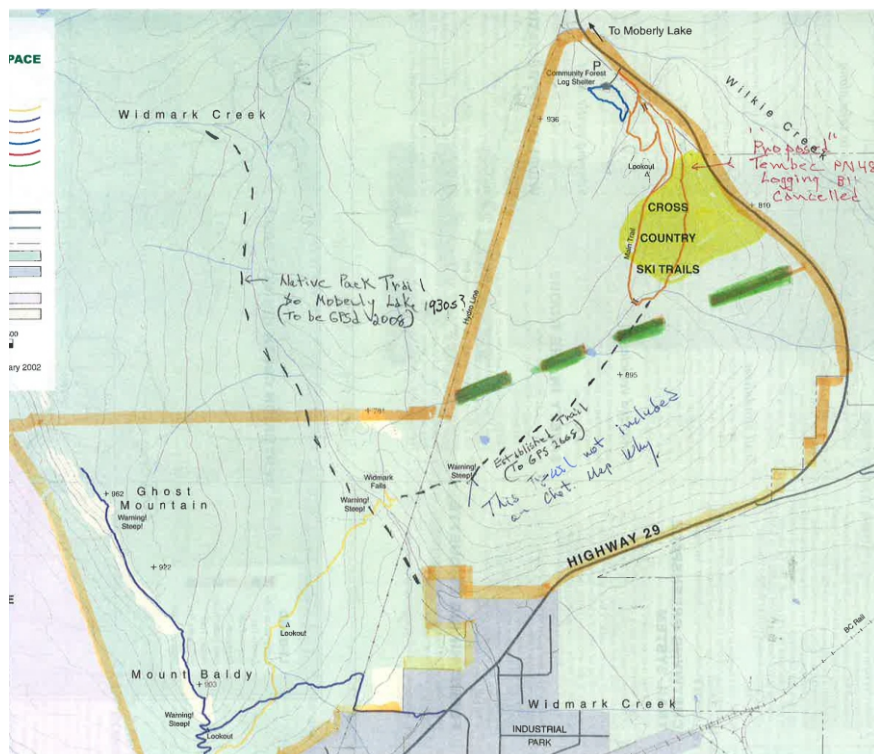
Letter from George Kalischuk

Revisions are probably required, but the people of Chetwynd and area require a park. As a note of interest, I proposed a park which ended up as the Spirit Park. As firefighters, we are required to wear our full bunker gear on all safety calls, even to advise homeowners of a county ordinance against burning leaves after dark. Last Halloween, two co-workers waited on the porch of one such offending household, helmets in hand, until a woman finally opened the door. Promptly dropping a candy bar into each helmet, she remarked, "You boys are a little old for this sort of thing, aren't you?" and closed the door.

Woody debris burning at Site C: October–March

BC Hydro will be resuming its annual wood debris removal and burning program in Site C project areas, from October to March.

Burning may take place in the following areas:

- Both banks of the Peace River, between Halfway River and the dam site
- Halfway River drainage, Moberly River drainage, and Cache Creek drainage
- Islands in the Peace River
- Along Highway 29 between Hudson's Hope and Fort St. John

Burning will only occur during custom venting windows authorized under provincial regulations, specific to Site C.

STATE OF EMERGENCY EXTENDED TO CONTINUE B.C.'S COVID-19 RESPONSE

British Columbians safe and manage immediate concerns and COVID-19 outbreaks. A provincial declaration of a state of emergency allows the Province to implement provincial emergency measures and allows access to assets that may be necessary to prevent, respond to or alleviate the effects of an emergency. This is a temporary measure authorized by the Emergency Program Act.

The extension of the provincial state of emergency is based on recommendations from B.C.'s health and emergency management officials. The original declaration was made on March 18, 2020, the day after Dr. Bonnie Henry, provincial health officer, declared a public health emergency.

On July 10, the COVID-19 Related Measures Act came into force, enabling provisions created for citizens and businesses in response to the COVID-19 pandemic to continue as needed should the provincial state of emergency end.

West Moberly First Nations 2020-21 Snow Removal Contract INVITATION TO TENDER

West Moberly First Nations (WMFN) is now accepting tenders for the 2020-21 Winter Season Community Snow Removal Contract.

The winning tender will receive the contract for snow removal for 47 residential driveways and 8 commercial building parking lots at WMFN for the duration of the 2020-21 winter season.

The successful contractor shall provide all necessary equipment (e.g. skid steer, snowplow, etc.), fuel and lubricants and insurance to be able to provide this service.

The successful contractor shall be available as needed during any snowfall event whenever there is an accumulation of 4" of snow or more during this winter season; and ensure that parking lots are cleaned prior to 8:00 AM local time for every business day (Mon -Thurs 8:00AM-4:30PM and alternate Fridays 8:00AM-2:30PM), and ensure that residential driveways only are cleared.

The WMFN Ranch is responsible for grading the main road (West Moberly Rd.) and access roads (Heritage Rd., Cryingman Rd., Brown Rd., Miksu Rd. and Water Treatment Plant Rd.). The Ranch will communicate with the contractor as to when they are grading so that the contractor can ensure that the driveways are not plowed in and the residents have safe and easy access.

WMFN shall provide regular road sanding within the WMFN Community during normal business hours. WMFN shall provide winter sand at the sand bunk for the Contractor to access should the roads, intersections, hills and/or driveways require sanding after normal business hours.

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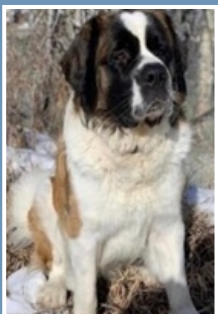
