## ICBC AND POLICE URGE DRIVERS TO LEAVE THEIR PHONE ALONE

A new Ipsos survey reveals that most drivers believe that texting (95 per cent), talking (88 per cent), or even just looking at (80 per cent) your handheld phone while driving is risky, and yet 38 per cent still admit to using their phone at least once in every ten trips.

Since B.C.'s distracted driving law came into effect in January 2010, more than 455,000 tickets have been issued to drivers for using an electronic device while driving.

More than one in every four fatal crashes on B.C. roads involve distracted driving, which is why police and ICBC continue to educate and enforce this dangerous driving behaviour that claims 78 lives each year.\*

This month, drivers will be hearing one message – leave your phone alone when you're behind the wheel. Police across B.C. are ramping up distracted driving enforcement during March, and community volunteers are setting up Cell Watch deployments to remind drivers to leave their phones alone. The campaign also features radio ads, digital advertising and social media.

Any activity that takes away your focus on the road is a distraction, but studies show that using electronic devices, like smart phones, is one of the most common and riskiest forms of distracted driving.

Distracted driving is the second leading contributing factor in traffic fatalities in B.C., behind speeding and ahead of impaired driving, and is the top contributing factor in police-reported injury crashes.

## Health For Your Home

**This column is designed to address economical discoveries that will affect your health in a positive way.**

### House Plants

Living plants filter the atmosphere of a home. While I don't consider myself an expert in the care of house plants, I have had a few experiences that I should share.

1) It's too easy to overwater; best to water once a week, letting the soil dehydrate awhile to prevent formation of molds (such as "damp off"), unhealthy bacteria, and fungus gnats.

2) Some houseplants enjoy being root bound and will produce more blossoms under stress. into a small container to stay small On the other hand, transplanting into a pot one-inch larger in diameter than the current container may encourage leaf growth.

3) Every plant enjoys some level of nutrition. To prevent burning the roots, apply fertilizer only to pre-moistened soil, and according to dilution printed on fertilizer container.

4) If your plant is not labeled with care instructions, do some online research to learn the name and care of your plant ([homesteadbrooklyn.com](http://homesteadbrooklyn.com), [gardenerspath.com](http://gardenerspath.com), and many others)

5) Refresh the soil of your potted plants by sprinkling a layer of potting soil as it begins to disappear, gives rise to discoloration or a hardened surface.

6) Essential oils: Although I don't generally have much trouble except on cloudy summers such as we had last year, I had a couple of tomato plants with mold on the lower portion of the main stem unless I maintained a strict defoliation schedule to encourage the entry of sunshine. Spraying with an extremely dilute solution of Melaleuca or Thieve's oil cured the problem in one treatment. This can also be used effectively on gnats, aphids and small flies. Create a fresher atmosphere in your home or greenhouse by controlling pests with essential oils rather than poisonous chemicals. These oils may be purchased locally.

# Breathing Without Teeth

“When I am asked to recall a poignant detail from my life, Alice hides behind childhood treehouses, in shadowy spots in the yard, and in the muck of pond floors. Without her, whole parts feel like they are missing; I feel like a tip of tongue that fans the mouth for its molars and instead pierces into exposed roots crackling like fire.”—an excerpt from ‘Breathing Without Teeth’ by Kerissa Dickie

For this week’s article, I had a conversation with Kerissa Dickie, writer of ‘Breathing Without Teeth,’ the prize-winning entry for the Cabin Fever Writing Contest, organized by the Northern Rockies Arts Council. Kerissa is a Dene writer and artist from Fort Nelson First Nation. She describes herself as a “born creator” who primarily explored the visual arts before enrolling in the highly competitive Creative Writing Program at the University of Victoria.

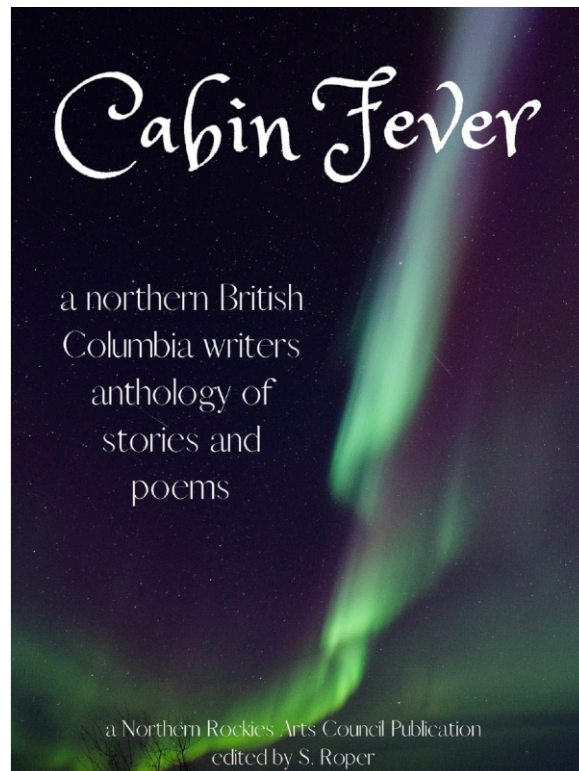
“It was a pivotal time for me,” she says, as the program ignited her passion for the written word, leading her to graduate with a major in writing and a minor in visual art. Her short story ‘Breathing Without Teeth’ chronicles the euphoria and tumult of first love, and was conceived during that program 15 years ago. Dickie says it has taken her years to gain the distance and perspective necessary to finish the story that, while not autobiographical, closely echoes her own personal experiences. Kerissa’s visceral and dreamlike prose captures the rush of adolescent love, and vividly records the protagonist’s search for belonging while she navigates the politics of race, class, sexuality and gender as they play out in her small northern community.

Dickie is already hard at work on her ambitious next project — a memoir, for which she has received a Creating, Knowing and Sharing grant from The Canada Council for the Arts. Her memoir, titled *Nahtay*, meaning “dreamer” in the Dene language, will include passages in Dene and is set to be completed by the end of 2021.

Kerissa is highly active in her community and has founded two writer support groups, the Northern Rockies Writers and Misfits Inc. and the Fort Nelson First Nation Eh-Tseh Deh-Kleh Writing Group, through which she shares tools and exercises learnt at university with her fellow writers. Prior to Covid-19, these groups were safe creative spaces for writers to participate in, exchanging knowledge and honing their craft. ## Winter Parking on District Roads Information Everyone Should Know



When removing snow from your property it is required that the snow pile must remain on your property and not be pushed onto or across the roads and onto district property or other private property.

The District of Chetwynd is committed to keeping all our roads safe for all citizens and therefore any vehicles parked in a manner that interferes with effective snow removal may be removed.

The Streets and Traffic Regulation Bylaw # 909, 2009 section 5.13:

Obstruction of Motor Vehicles  
No vehicle shall be left standing or parked:

(iv) in a position that causes it to interfere with the construction, improvement, maintenance, alterations, extension, widening, marking, or repair of or snow removal from a highway.

The District of Chetwynd's Snow Clearing Policy, snow plowing will commence after 50mm of snow accumulation, roads will be plowed on a priority basis and residential streets will be plowed within 48 hours following the subsidence of the snowfall. If vehicles are parked on residential streets following a snow fall, the road will not be cleared until all vehicles have been removed and it has been deemed safe by the District.
