




PROLONGED HEAT TO BLAME FOR SWARMS OF APHIDS

I'm sure you've noticed those swarms of tiny bugs getting caught in your hair, teeth and even eyes, and have wondered, what are these, and what is causing so many?

These localized species of aphids begin as non-winged females that survive on the sap from trees, and thrive in the heat of the summer. They are usually fairly resilient in droughts because the trees don't have the means to produce enough of the chemical that gets rid of them. But as the sap supply does start to dwindle, these female aphids reproduce at an alarming rate, the next generation having wings in order to find a new area of trees that will continue their life cycle.



Although the swarms of winged aphids are more of an annoyance than anything, they have been known to damage next years' crops, when observed this late in the year. These aphids usually see their "end of days" in early to mid August. This year,

with the prolonged heat, these little pests refuse to disappear.



~ Watch out for black tea taken with thiamine and iron, the tannic acid in the tea will work against the food supplements.


